On Jan. 1, the National Day of Cuba, 50 years of the triumph of the Cuban Revolution will be marked, a date when the nation won its independence

present, in expression of solidarity with other peoples, 38.148 Cuban doctors and health-care specialists work in 73 countries and two overseas territories.

At an early date, the revolutionary power eliminated the prevailing illiteracy and established the bases to make free universal education at different levels readily accessible to the people. Cuban teachers extend their cooperation to other countries, where the Cuban method of alphabetization, "Yo si puedo," officially recognized by UNESCO, has benefited hundreds of thousands of people.

The vast and important transformation in the field of education enabled the creation of a series of research and development centers that contribute decisively to the

scientific and technological progress of the country. The triumphs of Cuban athletes at the great international sports events are indicators of the courage and bring about massive participation of citizens of

In the Japanese market, my country acquires products of high quality and sophisticated technology for the national health system. Prestigious Japanese companies, at different moments, have provided equipment for the construction, mining and fishing industries, and they are also present in the automotive and transport fields, and in the power-generation sector. Cuba extracts inside its ter-

ritory almost one half of the petroleum and gas that it consumes, having in addition in its exclusive maritime zone within the Gulf of Mexico, verified reserves of 9 billion barrels of petroleum and 630 billion cubic meters of natural Japanese enterprises in the sector to participate in contracts for the exploitation of the said resources in the same way as oil companies of other

The national pharmaceutical industry has been gaining prestige and increasing importance as one of the major export areas of the country, including, together with generic drugs, new medicines obtained by means of biotechnology such as vaccines against hepatitis B and meningitis, and also drugs to treat certain types of carcinomas. This is a sector where opportunities for Japanese companies exist.

Traditionally, Cuba exports to Japan world-famous cigars, rum of reputed quality, coffee, lobsters and organic agricultural produce whose presence

My government would like in the international market is progressively increasing.

Tourism constitutes one of the pillars of the national economv and Cuba receives over 2 million travelers annually. This figure has grown by over 4.5 percent annually for the last five years. Visitors find in my country beautiful beaches of white sand; splendid tropical nature and moderate climate; cities declared as World Heritage sites; and vigorous and diverse cultural and sporting events.

In particular, tourists receive the joyous hospitality of people who live in an atmosphere of environmental health and security, all of which constitute a very attractive destination. The participation of Japanese investors and tourism companies in the relevant fields is welcome.

In 2009, we mark the 80th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Cuba and Japan, an event in which we celebrate the bonds that have developed in a framework of friendship, respect and mutual benefit.

The commemoration of that important event must serve to stimulate action on both sides in different spheres like culture, academia, science, business and sports, as well as parliamentary interchanges. All these efforts will expand reciprocal knowledge, and deepen and broaden the existing good bilateral relations. It is equally a good opportunity to identify common themes and areas in the global agenda on which we can work together for a better world.

It is regrettable that in 2008 after Raul Castro assumed the position of president of the Council of State of Cuba, the

economy momentarily worsened. It is known that the causes are completely external: the sudden rise of prices of international

commodities, like grain and petroleum: the sudden fall of the prices of nickel, which is the main export item for Cuba; and the reduction of credits caused by the worldwide financial crisis. To make matters worse. three hurricanes hit Cuba in 2008, which destroyed homes, farm products and power supply facilities. However, I believe the Cuban nation can work together to overcome these dif-

Our Japan-Cuba Economic Conference dispatched a mission to Cuba at the beginning of September. We held dialogue with senior Cuban officials and deepened our mutual understanding. We are pleased to have played an important role so that the negotiations on short-term debt rescheduling were started, which was inevitable because of the Cuban situation mentioned above. As a result, a final agreement was reached to open the way to restart Japanese exports.

I am very happy to hear that the minister of state, Ricardo Cabrisas, after working for years as president of the Cuba-Japan Economic Conference, was promoted to vice president of the Council of Ministers in the middle of October. One of his recognized accomplishments in the field of international economics should be the strengthening of the relation ship with our Japanese side of the conference. At the same time, the minister of foreign trade, Raul de la Nuez, was des ignated as the new president of the Cuban side. I am sure that the conference's new Cubar president will play an active role in reinforcing bilateral eco nomic relations in the future.

2009 marks the 80th anniversarv of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Japan and Cuba. While bilat eral relations between the two countries become stronger, as the Japan-Cuba Economic Conference we are prepared to make more efforts to strengthen the commercial relationship between both coun-
