# UAE and Japan celebrate their increasingly close ties

On this very auspicious occasion of our 38th National Day, I most honored and

privileged to convey, on be half of the government and people of the United Arab Emirates (UAE),

heartfelt greetings and best wishes to Their Imperial Majesties Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko, the government and the great people of Japan. I also extend my sincere felicitations to H.H. Sheik Khalifa bin Zayed Al-Nahyan, president of the UAE, ruler of Abu Dhabi, H.H. Sheik Mohammed bin Rashid Al-Maktoum, vice president, prime minister and ruler of Dubai, the members of the Supreme Council and rulers of

the Emirates, and to people of

the United Arab Emirates. For the past 38 years, the relationship between the UAE and Japan has been characterized by close cooperation in a variety of fields. In fact, both counties share a genuine enthusiasm to promote further dialogues at all levels, widening the scope of cooperation and deepening friendly ties. This year in particular has been marked by a series of momentous events, starting with a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on peaceful nuclear energy cooperation signed between our two countries in January to fufill future power and energy demands. The MOU concerning the potential development of peaceful nuclear power will uphold standards of nonproliferation, safety and security. We expect that access to Japanese technology in this field will enable the UAE to meet a massive increase in demand for power and energy in coming decades.

The most significant achievement by the UAE this year was its successful bid to host the headquarters of the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA) where UAE garnered the majority of votes in Sharm Al-Sheikh. The IR-ENA headquarters will be located in Abu Dhabi's Masdar City, the world's first carbonneutral, zero-waste city that is powered entirely by renewable energy. Hosting the IRENA headquarters is proof of our entry into the post-oil era and affirms our readiness to shoulder our international responsibilities and help the world face challenges related to the diversification of energy sources.

I am also happy to say that the UAE placed 28th in the world and first in the Arab region in the promotion of prosperity and general satisfaction with life in a global survey of 104 states, according to a report by the Legatum Institute, an independent research, policy and advisory organization. "Within the UAE, Dubai has moved past dependence on oil exports towards a more diversified economy based on attracting international capital and talent," says the institute.

Such impressive achievements attract foreign investments and create vast business opportunities. The UAE has become a vital center of trade to all companies and businessmen

looking for investment opportunities, ensuring safety, security, stability, transparency of laws and legislation. Those who choose to set up businesses in the UAE will find a hospitable and simple process, an active open economy and an opportunity to penetrate neighboring

The aeronautical agreement that was concluded between our two countries allows our national carriers, Emirates Airlines and Etihad Airways, to both operate direct flights from Abu Dhabi and Dubai to Narita five times a week each. With these new links, it is expected that the number of Japanese travelers and tourists visiting the UAE will increase. I am sure these links will enhance economic and tourism activities as well as cultural and educational relations. I would like to seize this opportunity and extend my thanks to the Japanese authorities concerned for their tireless efforts during the negotiations, which made this important aeronautical agree ment a reality.

In terms of energy policy, I would like to assure you that our government will maintain its position as a secure and a reliable oil supplier to Japan. To strengthen cooperation further in this important field, the government of Abu Dhabi and Japan earlier this year signed a memorandum for joint cooperation in the field of energy.

Other aspects of cooperation between the UAE and Japan have been burgeoning as well. There is an effort in the UAE to expand cooperation to include basic industries such as steel, aluminum and petrochemicals.

Mutual visits between our two countries' officials have been rising. In October of this year, Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Masayuki Naoshima visited the UAE in the first official visit by a Japanese senior official since the new Cabinet's inauguration in September. He held fruitful talks with high-level UAE officials, including Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces H.H. General Sheik Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan. These active exchanges of high officials underpin the importance and emphasis that each side places upon bilateral

ways shared the view that education is an essential foundation for nation-building. Many UAE children are now attending Japanese school in Abu Dhabi as a result of a UAE initiative that aims to diversify the education process and foster better understanding of other cultures. The UAE seeks to deepen cooperation in this field further by signing memorandums of understanding and agreements with a number of Japanese universities. As a result of that endeavor, student exchanges have leaped forward. Now there are roughly 40 UAE students enrolled in different Japanese universities and this number will increase in the years ahead. We would also like to under-

line the notable progress that the UAE and Japan have achieved in infrastructure development. Japanese builders played a vital role in the construction of Dubai Metro. The world's longest automated driverless metro and the first in the Arab region, Dubai Metro began operating in September. Abu Dhabi has also embarked on an ambitious metro railway project that will alleviate traffic jams and reduce growth in the number of vehicles.

Other Emirates such as Sharjah, Ajman and Ras Al Khaimah have been heavily engaged in massive infrastructure projects that will boost economic output.

Of special significance as well was the move by the JCCME to open a UAE-Japan desk in Abu Dhabi. Such a move will have a significant impact on bilateral relations and provide lucrative investment opportunities for Japanese companies in the UAE's growing market.

The historic Etihad Formula 1 Grand Prix, which took place in Abu Dhabi on Nov. 1 at Yas Marina Circuit on Yas Island, attracted a large audience from all over the world and received spectacular coverage in the international media. The event gave a boost to UAE tourism; after the Formula 1 race Abu Dhabi was selected as one of the best 10 cities in the world.

In 2008 the UAE economy expanded by 7.4 percent with a GDP nominal figure of Dh929.4 billion, compared to around Dh729.7 billion in 2007. The swift and effective measures taken by the government following the onset of the financial crisis helped key economic sectors such as construction, real estate, financial services and oil to regain their balance.

While the international fi nancial crisis has affected the whole world, the situation in the UAE is not as gloomy as some mass media try to portray it. Being resilient with strong fundamentals coupled with a wise long-term economic strategy, the UAE economy is more than capable of withstanding the financial crisis and moving ahead confidently. Official statistics show that economic growth will be back on track by the last quarter of 2009 and star
