Our National Day this year has a special significance since it also marks the re-election of His Excellency Mahinda Rajapaksa in the recently concluded Presidential Election in Sri Lanka. The historic victory of President Rajapaksa in the election, which for the first time in decades covered the entire country, as a result of the defeat of terrorism, will enable the consolidation of peace and rapid economic de-

rum has been a great source of encouragement for us. Sri Lanka and Japan cooperate closely within regional forums such as the Colombo Plan, the ASEAN Regional Forum and the Asia Cooperation Dialogue.

I recall with gratitude the government of Japan's continued support to Sri Lanka over the years in the field of development assistance and technical cooperation. That support has covered many areas such as transportation, telecommunications, irrigation, agriculture, fisheries and power and energy. In recent years, our relations have assumed a new impetus as a result of growing economic collaboration. We expect further growth in the coming year in the areas of tourism, investment, trade, educational exchanges as well as interparliamentary visits.

An important landmark in recent bilateral cooperation was the construction funded jointly by both governments of a museum at the UNESCO World Heritage site of Sigiriya. The Sigiriya Museum, which opened in July, will greatly encourage visitors to learn more about the historical importance, natural beauty and cultural splendor of Sigiriya. The Sigiriya Museum will remain a special symbol of the cultural relations between Sri Lanka and Japan. The museum will be a repository of our heritage in literature, architecture, sculpture and painting.

Sri Lanka stands today at a historic moment of tremendous opportunity and begins a new chapter in nation building following the end of more than three decades of terrorism. Peace has now been bestowed on our country. The aspirations of all our communities to live in peace and harmony as one nation has materialized. As peace and prosperity beck-

As our forefathers did in the glorious days of our past, and the more recent leaders in the struggle for freedom showed us, we remain committed to a single, unitary Sri Lanka, where all our people, irrespective of differences of ethnicity, religion or political persuasion, can enjoy the full benefits of freedom, development and equal rights in a democratic society.

The new and even stronger mandate you have given us gives greater confidence to move ahead in building the "New" Sri Lanka, which we envisage as the hub of economic activity and a beacon of progress in our region; together with a full commitment to the Rights of Man which are integral to the heritage bestowed on us from the past.

On this historic and significant anniversary of freedom, let us rededicate our nation to the ideals of peace, tolerance, mutual trust and progress, in the democratic tradition our people have cherished and protected as the oldest democracy in Asia.
