Boasting political stability in a region with high turbulence, Benin is preparing a presidential and legislative coupled ballot in 2011. Taking advantage of this stability, the country has now acquired the status of a major troop contributor to the peacekeeping operations under the United Nations or regional organizations in Africa and beyond.

But poverty remains pregnant and some five years on, in 2015, it is not obvious Benin will achieve the eight Millennium Development Goals. It intends to keep this difficult challenge regarding education, gender equality, maternal and child health and AIDS. International assistance can help. Same for poverty. To achieve an emerging and prosperous economy by 2025, President Yayi planned to complement political democracy with economic renewal. Therefore, for an emerging Benin, he undertook to continue the implementation and realization of mere infrastructure highly needed, as to engage important structural reforms.


