

This year marks the 40th anniversary of the Independence and National Day of Bangladesh. On this auspicious occasion, we recall with the deepest veneration the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman who, by virtue of his charismatic leadership and profound patriotism, led our nation to independence in 1971.

We recall with the deepest respect the supreme sacrifice our valiant martyrs and freedom fighters made for our lib-



eration. We pay our most sincere tribute to the selfless leaders, organizers and supporters of our War of Liberation in 1971. I take this opportunity also to congratulate our nationals living in Japan who are making important contributions to the economies of Bangladesh and Japan, and our bilateral relations.

We are observing the occasion in a totally different atmosphere, in a solemn and subdued manner, than we envisaged even two weeks ago. We are deeply shocked and grieved by the immense loss of life and massive destruction inflicted by the deadly earthquake and giant tsunami that hit Japan on March 11. We pray for the salvation and eternal peace of those thousands who lost their lives, and convey our deepest condolences to the survivors of this enormous tragedy. We hope and pray that the great people of Japan will be able to overcome this huge calamity by virtue of their patience, forbearance, resilience and vigor,

and rebuild their lives soon.

The Hon'ble Prime Minister and foreign minister of Bangladesh expressed their deepest sympathy and support on behalf of the people and government of Bangladesh soon after the earthquake. The Cabinet and the National Parliament also adopted proposals of condolence.

The Hon'ble Prime Minister also conveyed to the Japanese ambassador in Dhaka our offer to send a rescue team, relief materials, etc. A C-130 flight with necessary relief items is expected to arrive in Japan anytime.

Moreover, this embassy organized March 15 a one-minute silence and special prayer for the eternal peace for the departed souls, and a quick recovery from the current difficulties. Earlier March 15, the embassy sent a rescue team, including members of the Bangladesh community, to Sendai and rescued 52 Bangladesh nationals. The members of the Bangladesh community are al-

so taking part in voluntary activities to mitigate the sufferings of our Japanese friends by standing beside them during these trying hours. The mission operates almost round the clock to coordinate efforts by our government, the host government and the Bangladesh community in Japan to meet the challenges of the disaster.

Let me share with you that the government of Bangladesh under the dynamic leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, the worthy daughter of the Father of the Nation, is making tremendous progress in achieving food autarky, women's empowerment, poverty alleviation and other socioeconomic development, including an IT-based e-governance in pursuance of the Vision 2021 for a digitized Bangladesh.

It is in recognition of this very success that Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina was awarded the UNMDG Award last year. The government has taken measures to end the energy shortfalls by the year 2013. Our liberal economic policies and the recent unfaltering annual growth have steadied us on course to becoming a middle-income country by this decade while attracting international attention as one of the "Next Eleven" and "Frontier Five" emerging economies.
