The Republic of the Congo is a French-speaking country with a surface area of 342,000 sq. km and a population of 4,012.800. The nation is bordered by Cameroon and the Central African Republic to the north, the Republic of Angola to the south, the Democratic Republic of the Congo to the east, and by Gabon and the Atlantic Ocean to the west. Concerning the economic features, the CFA Franc is the currency (pegged to the euro; €1 = 656.57 CFA Franc), and Congo's gross domestic product (GDP) is \$15.2 billion, income per capita \$4,238 and the GDP breakdown

is agriculture, livestock and fishing (7.9 percent), industry (48.5 percent), services (40.5 percent), with four specialized economic zones and an inflation rate of 3

percent

Brazzaville is the capital (1,373,000 inhabitants) and Pointe-Noire the economic capital, open to the sea. Both

are linked by a 510-km railroad. The deep-water port of Pointe-Noire, the railroad and the Congo River are strategic and advantageous for Congo as an ideal land of transit for goods being shipped or carried to other countries.

Oil, timber, gas, gold, diamonds, copper, lead, silver, phosphates, potassium, magnesium; rivers (Congo, Ubangi); large forests (22.2 million hectares) with a variety of trees (limba, sapele, bahia, ebony, sipo, kambala) are also home to wild animals (elephants, antelopes, buffaloes, lions, gorillas). The fertile land is also appropriated for agriculture and livestock. All these huge natural resources allied to peace and stability are warranties for investment in Congo, thanks to the President of the Republic H. E. Sassou Nguesso, a "man of peace and concrete actions."

That's why our call today is an invitation to Japanese investors to join the process of modernizing and industrializing the Congo, through the president of the republic's program called "The path of the future." So, the new process of celebration of the national day called the "accelerated development of cities," created nearly a decade by the head of state, and the National Plan of Development 2012-2016, adopted last year by the parliament, are both mechanisms to implement "The path of the

future." The "accelerated development of cities" is a process that encourages the prefectures or departments to host the celebration of the Independence

Day (instead of Brazzaville, the capital), according to a rotation plan. Beyond this passion, the aim is to make Congo become an emerging country in 2025.
