constitution not concerning the number of terms of the president or the maximum age of the candidates.

Under the leadership of President Abdel Aziz, the sub-regional organization, G5 Sahel (Mauritania, Mali, Niger, Chad and Burkina Faso), is totally committed to fight against terrorism and all forms of trafficking and take measures for employment, to encourage investments and to fight against poverty.

As president of the African Union in 2014, President Abdel Aziz has taken many actions and initiatives to ensure the key role of Africa around the world.

In this regard, the Mauritanian government and people acknowledge greatly the positive impacts of Japanese official development aid to our vital sectors such as infrastructure, food security, environmental protec-

tion, fisheries, health, education and others.

The reforms initiated by the government have seen Mauritania classified as one of the best business environments among the major African countries by the World Bank's "Doing Business 2015 Report."

Mauritania is firmly committed to strengthen its cooperation with Japan both by the Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD) process and the Arab-Japan Forum, taking into account that Mauritania participated in TICAD VI in Nairobi in August and in the fourth Arab-Japan Economic Forum in Casablanca in May.
