Looking back over the past 202 years of its existence, Greece has emerged as a vibrant democratic society, an active member of the international community and a nation committed to democratic principles, human rights and the rule of law. Greece is a reliable member of the European Union and NATO, and a strong economic partner in Southeast Europe. Over the years, Greece has forged partnerships and cooperation with friendly states, with which we share the same values and principles and jointly support freedom, international peace, democracy and the rule of law. Adhering to these principles

has proven to be crucial today, at a time when their validity is threatened by unlawful actions.

Japan is one of the nations with which Greece maintains strong and fruitful relations in modern times. The establishment of diplomatic relations between our countries took place 124 years ago and our relations have grown stronger ever since. Our nations have longer histories and rich culture and share common traditions and characteristics. Both Greece and Japan have laid valuable foundations in science, art and philosophy and set standards for others to follow. Also, Japanese and Greeks share a living and loving relationship with the sea and maritime life.

More recently, in January, the bonds between our two countries were reaffirmed and strengthened when Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis, accompanied by a government and a business delegation, visited Tokyo and held high-level and timely meetings with their counterparts in the leadership of government and business.

After almost two decades since the previous summit between our two countries. the two heads of government reaffirmed their shared values and common understanding on international and security issues, and their will to expand further the bilateral relations in economics and trade, in international cooperation, in culture and in diverse joint projects. The two sides signed a joint statement on strategic cooperation between Greece and Japan and

several agreements on a wide spectrum of cooperation.

It is significant that this year's Greek National Day finds our two countries at such a high level of cooperation. During difficult times, such as the ones our world is facing, Greece and Japan remain steady in their support of partnership, shared democratic values and a rules-based society. From our side, as we honor past accomplishments, we are determined to look ahead with optimism so that we can accomplish even more together in the years to come.
