The Mongolian government has declared "Welcome to Mongolia" as the slogan for 2023 to 2025, a period that has been designated as the time to visit Mongolia. This catchphrase captures the essence of Mongolian hospitality and our eagerness to welcome visitors from around the world to experience the natural beauty, rich culture and warm hospitality of our country.
