TIBOR SZENDREI CHARGE D'AFFAIRES OF HUNGARY



Nearly seven decades have passed since Oct. 23, 1956, when the Hungarian people showed the world how bravery and perseverance could make a difference in the face of brutal oppression.

Although the revolution was suppressed at that time, it made lasting changes in Hungary as well as the world. In the past 67 years, Hungary has cast off the shackles of communism, become a member of the European Union, and developed into one of the main economic engines of Europe. Being in the geographic, economic and trade center of Europe, as well as being one of the most important focal points of battery and car manufacturing in the world, it has welcomed nearly 200 Japanese companies and counting.

Apart from economic strength, it is hard to pinpoint what makes Hungary so special, because we're blessed with an abundance of cultural wealth. Our history of music with brilliant composers such as Liszt, Lehar, Bartok, Kodaly or Ligeti could very well make the list. The culinary specialties of Tokaj wine, goulash soup, chimney cake and foie gras may also steal the hearts of many. Not to mention the athletic prowess Hungary has consistently shown throughout centuries, winning the most gold medals per capita. In 2023, among other events, Hungary hosted the World Athletics Championships, providing a successful showing and passing the baton to Tokyo in preparation for 2025.

In the end, I believe our scientific edge is one of our most eye-catching peculiarities. Without Hungarians, there would be no Rubik's Cube, ballpoint pen, dynamo, safety match or game theory. Based on nationality, Hungarians are among the most frequent recipients of Nobel Prizes in the world, even though Hungary's population is less than 10 million. This has only

been confirmed by the two Nobel Prizes received by Hungarian nationals earlier this month. One in the field of medicine for Katalin Kariko, who developed the mRNA vaccine that safely led us out of the COVID-19 pandemic (Kariko also received the prestigious Japan Prize last year and the Keio Medical Science Prize in 2021). The other in the field of physics for Ferenc Krausz, who developed a technology that enables the analysis of light impulses on an atomic scale of time.

Since it is important for us that we share our culture and heritage with Japan, a country with whom we boast 154 years of friendly relations, we are trying to create many opportunities to taste, try and feel Hungary in the Japanese archipelago. This year, we once again held our Hungarian Festival on Oct. 21 at Ark Karajan Square in Tokyo's Akasaka district, where people had a chance to enjoy the melodies of Hungarian classics, taste Hungarian street food or acquaint themselves with the works of Hungarian artists in Japan.
