As Tunisia celebrates the 54th anniversary of its independence, it is my great pleasure to extend on behalf of His Excellency President Zine El Abidine Ben Ali my respectful greetings to Their Imperial Majesties the Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko, the members of the Imperial family, the government and the friendly people of Japan.

Last October, legislative and presidential elections were held in Tunisia that confirmed the progress of the democratic process ushered in by President Ben Ali and the attachment of the Tunisian people to the country's social and economic achievements under his leadership.

Giving political and economic visibility to the excellent relations between our two countries as well as further promoting mutual understanding and direct contact between our two peoples and cultures are among our main objectives.

In May 2010, the Seventh Japan-Tunisia Joint Committee Meeting will be held in Tunis to examine new ways to enhance the bilateral relations and cooperation as well as to exchange views on various regional and international subjects.

Tunisia will also be hosting this year the second edition of the Japan-Arab World Economic Forum; we will work hard to ensure its success and we are confident that it will contribute to raising the awareness of Tunisia as a hub in Africa,

the Arab World and the Mediterranean among Japanese business decision makers.

A Tunisian-Japan Business Group will soon be set up in order to promote direct contacts between the Japanese and the Tunisian business communities and create new business opportunities. Hopefully, more and more Japanese companies will be attracted by Tunisia's proximity and preferential trading relations with the European Union, its highly qualified human resources as well as an Investment Code that offers foreign investors considerable incentives and fiscal exemptions.

In order to increase the cultural and touristic proximity between our two peoples, we have also been working on the establishment of direct flights between our two countries and I am very glad to announce that the first trial service between Tokyo and Tunis will soon be launched by charter flights.

Since June 2009, a major ex-

hibition tracing the legacy of the Tunisian city of Carthage is touring Japan and will last in total a year and a half, visiting the cities of Sendai; Kanazawa, Ishikawa Prefecture; Tokyo; Okayama; Morioka, Iwate Prefecture; Kyoto; Hamamatsu, Shizuoka Prefecture; Miyazaki; and Nagoya. More than 150 precious artworks from the Punic and Roman eras including a collection of mosaics reputed to be the finest in the world have been brought from national museums in Tunisia in what can be described as a great example of cultural cooperation between our two countries. Friends of Carthage Associations are also being created in each city visited by the exhibition.

I would like to conclude by expressing our sincere gratitude to all the friends of Tunisia in Japan for their continuous support and goodwill to further enhance the excellent relations between our two countries.

Since last summer, the exhibition "Ancient Carthage and Rome" has been touring nine cities in Japan and attracting many people, which has been leading to the establishment of Friends of Carthage Associations in each city to deepen mutual understanding between peoples of both countries.

Finally, on the occasion of the National Day, I would like to extend my warmest wishes for the good health and further prosperity of H.E. President Ben Ali and all the people of the Republic of Tunisia.


Tourism between Tunisia and Japan is growing gradually, but I believe Tunisia has great potential for the tourism industry in Japan.

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
