

The Extraordinary Islamic Solidarity Summit in Makkah, Saudi Arabia, was opened on Aug. 14 in the presence of presidents, prime ministers, kings, and heads of delegations from a number of Islamic countries. The summit aimed to achieve its goals of uniting ranks, achieving solidarity and comprehensive development, adopting moderation and tolerance, and rejecting extremism, sectarianism, differences and discord. King Abdullah suggested in the summit to establish a center for dialogue among Islamic sects to come to

common terms, with the capital

of Rivadh as its headquarters. The first concerns of King

Abdullah were to touch the people's needs and closely study their conditions in order to improve the people's living standards and to strengthen the course of the national economy.

Despite the global financial crisis that has dragged down leading economies, the Kingdom has avoided serious repercussions, not to mention the lack of the public and private indebtedness that has devastated other nations. Instead, the kingdom enjoyed its 11th consecutive year of growth, at a rate of 4.1 percent, with the non-oil economy growing at 4.9 percent.

A budget surplus of 5.2 percent of gross domestic product (GDP) was achieved. Furthermore, the kingdom saw its 12th consecutive balance of payments surplus, equaling 250.3 billion Saudi riyals (\$66.74 billion). In addition, the inflation rate increased slightly from 5.1 percent in 2009 to 5.3 percent in 2010, falling to 5.2 percent by October 2011, because of the rise to the costs of

The kingdom has maintained its top ranking among Middle Eastern and North African nations regarding ease of doing business, according to the annual report of the World Bank **CONTINÚED ON PAGE 5**

Group and the International Finance Corp., which was released in 2011. At the international level, the 2012 report ranked the kingdom the 12th easiest place for commercial transactions out of 187 nations. The high rating is a result of improvements introduced by the kingdom that have streamlined governmental procedures and promoted entrepreneurship.

According to the Global Competitiveness Report 2012-2013 issued by the World Economic Forum, Saudi Arabia ranks the 18th most competitive economy in the world. Saudi Arabia has continued to grow its economy since joining the World Trade Organization in 2005. According to the International Monetary Fund, the kingdom's economic expansion rate increased in 2011, as Saudi GDP grew by 7.1 percent. The non-oil economy expanded by 8 percent — the largest amount since 1981 — and inflation remained at 5 percent. Meanwhile, new initiatives to tackle critical issues, including unemployment, housing and the financing of small and medium businesses, were launched, as

government spending increased by 20 percent.

The kingdom opens its doors to Japanese tourists with its traditional hospitality so that discerning visitors can enjoy and experience places from archaeological wonders and historic sites to a great diversity of traditional and modern attractions, scenic beauty and the remarkable wild-life in our country.

Bilateral relations

Official contacts between Saudi Arabia and Japan began in 1938, when Hafiz Wahba, Saudi envoy to England, visited Japan to attend the inauguration of the Tokyo Mosque. In reciprocation, Masayuki Yokoyama, Japanese envoy to Egypt, visited the kingdom in 1939, and had an audience with King Abdulaziz Al Saud who founded the modern kingdom of Saudi Arabia. In 1953, Japan sent an economic delegation to Saudi Arabia. In 1955, the two countries formally

established diplomatic relations.

The bilateral relationship between Saudi Arabia and Japan marks its 57th anniversary this year, and is distinctively built on common values and shared

interests. It has proven to be a model for bridging the gap between people and culture. This relationship has witnessed important developments through the reciprocal visits by the leading figures in the two countries, which strengthened the friendly relations.

The visit to Japan by His Royal Highness Crown Prince Sultan bin Abdulaziz; the deputy premier; the minister of defense and aviation; and the inspector general in 1960 marked the beginning of bilateral visits by dignitaries of both nations.

On this auspicious occasion, we would like to reiterate on behalf of the people of Saudi Arabia, our heartfelt greetings, respect and best wishes for the Imperial family and the friendly people of Japan. I hope the solid bonds that exist between Saudi Arabia and Japan — one of the longest, most influential and closest relationships in the world

— will further strengthen. Subsequently, I cannot emphasize more that the Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia in Tokyo as a whole is always keen to serve fully the further and future development of our two countries.

Since Japan and the kingdom established diplomatic relations in 1955, the friendship and partnership between the two countries has ever been greating and


deepening. In April last year, Japan was invited to the Janadriah Festival, becoming the first guest country from Asia to join the annual Saudi national feast of heritage and culture. The Japan Pavilion, which presented exhibitions of Japan's history, culture and innovative technologies, attracted some 300,000 visitors.

During this past year, we saw the relations between the Saudi and Japanese governments continuing to grow closer. Yukio Edano, minister of economy, trade and industry, visited the kingdom in October last year, and Koichiro Genba, minister of foreign affairs, in January this year. From Saudi Arabia, H. E. Nizar bin Obaid Madani, state minister for foreign affairs, came to Tokyo in November last year, and H.E. Tawfiq bin Fawzan Alrabiah, minister of commerce and industry, and H.E. Mohammad bin Sulaiman Aljasser, minister of economy and planning, in February this year.

On the economic front, the Japan-Saudi Arabia Business Council, the joint meeting of the Japanese and Saudi private sectors launched in 1999, held its 12th annual conference in Tokyo in January this year. Approximately 160 participants from Japan and Saudi Arabia had lively discussions on new opportunities for Japan-Saudi business cooperation. Their efforts of more than a decade have begun to deliver positive results. This year, a Japanese truck assembler, a submarine cable manufacturer and a reverse-osmosis desalination membrane producer, as well as some other manufacturing companies from Japan, started their production operations one after another in Saudi Arabia. Since Saudi Arabia has great potential to become a crucial strategic location for Japanese companies seeking to expand businesses in the Gulf countries and the Middle East, Japan-Saudi business cooperation of this kind is expected to further increase in the years ahead.

The Japan-Saudi Arabia Society has, since its inception, been working to promote cultural exchange between the peoples of the two countries through various kinds of projects, including producing books on Saudi Arabia and Islam and offering Arabic language courses. In June this year, we published "The Jurisprudence for the Muslim Minorities," a guide on the Islamic law for Muslims living in a non-Islamic society, written by Ko Nakata and others. We at the society will continue to be firmly committed to working to strengthen the ties between Japan and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and promoting the understanding of Islam among the people of Japan.

In closing, I would like to offer my best wishes to the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, His Royal Highness Crown Prince Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, and H. E.
