It's been a year since the last message of the Embassy of the Republic of Belarus to the readers of The Japan Times. And this time has not been wasted in terms of Belarusian-Japanese relations.

Our cooperation in the sphere of rehabilitation of the regions that suffered from the Fukushima No. I nuclear disaster has been deeply developed, including direct contacts with the representatives of the Diet, several specialized governing bodies, business and public organizations. In December 2012 an intergovernmental agreement for cooperation in overcoming the consequences of nuclear power plant accidents was signed.

During the year there have been mutual visits of more than 30 groups of specialists from both countries, concerning the problems of child rehabilitation, agriculture in the regions exposed to radioactive contamination, medical and social care, radiation-level monitoring, and the legislative support of central and local governments in the regions affected by the accident. There is no doubt that effective cooperation between our countries in this area will help to solve the problems of rehabilitation in Fukushima Prefecture, as well as the adjacent sea area, much quicker and at lower cost.

Belarus takes part in these activities with an open heart — for we will never forget the support Japan provided and still provides to our country after the horrible Chernobyl disaster.

Still our cooperation in the area of rehabilitaion is just one side of our mutual work in the field of economic and humanitarian cooperation.

The interactions between

large Japanese companies, such as Marubeni, Toshiba, Sojitz, Sharp, and Belarusian chemical and microelectronic enterprises, relating to Japanese high-tech equipment supplies to our country, have been developing steadily in recent months. On the other hand, there has also been growth in exports of Belarusian hightechnology products, such as laser equipment, dosimetric and radiometric monitoring devices, physiological analysis equipment and modern chemical fibers. In 2012 the heads of several key Belarusian institutions — such as the Ministry of Economics, Ministry of Industry, Ministry of **Emergency Situations, Chamber** of Commerce — paid a working visit to Japan. Thus a background for reconsidering the importance of the economic partnership between our two countries has been formed.

economic situation, with growth in industrial and agricultural production, followed by growth in GDP and exports of our production to more than 100 countries all over the world. The preparations for the 2014 Ice Hockey World Championships, which will take place in Minsk, are being completed.

Belarus plays an active role in the development of international relations, being one of the founding members of the United Nations, it takes the initiative in solving pressing global issues. Belarus develops its relations with the world community based on the principles of neighborliness, mutual understanding, noninterference and nonuse of force in settling disputes. There are no interethnic or interfaith contradictions in Belarus, although more than 100 nationalities representing all the major religions reside in our country. Together with the social-oriented state policy this forms the conditions in which social inequality is excluded completely.
