Japan and the Kingdom of Bahrain have traditionally maintained a very solid friendship. The relations between Japan and the Kingdom of Bahrain date back to 1934, when the first Bahraini oil shipments to Japan began after the discovery of oil in Bahrain in 1932. In May 1972, diplomatic relations between Japan and Bahrain were established and since then, the relationship between the two countries has become profound. In fact, Japan's imports from the Kingdom of Bahrain have been increasing during the past years, with the main source of imports being petroleum products and aluminum

The Kingdom of Bahrain, which is located at the heart of the Gulf region, is the gateway to the Middle East market as it has access to every market in the region by air, sea and road, quickly and efficiently. This strategic location provides Japanese companies with the fastest access to markets with high purchasing power for their goods and ser-

It is noteworthy that Bahrain's economy has long been the freest in the region for 19 years and has steadily improved its ranking worldwide. Today the Index of Economic Freedom ranks the country as 12th worldwide, ahead of G-7 economies. Furthermore, Bahrain gives approval to foreign companies to retain 100 percent foreign ownership and to benefit from the region's lowest taxes. In addition, the country has bilateral trade and economic agreements with more than 40 countries, as well as a free-trade agreement with the United States.

With the support of such environments, 26 Japanese companies have their bases in Bahrain and have been expanding their business in the region. To name a few in the financial services sector, in addition to existing names like Nomura Securities, Daiwa Securities and Bank of Tokyo Mitsubishi UFJ, which chose Bahrain because it has the most nancial center in the Middle East, Orix Corp. has come to Bahrain as a new face with an equity participation in Medgulf, the biggest insurance company in the Middle East, whose head office is located in Bahrain. In the manufacturing sector, Toyota, Yokogawa, Sasakura, Toshiba Power Systems, Fuji Electric,
