Bright future for relationship

Exactly 69 years ago, on Sept. 2, 1945, in the historic Ba Dinh

Square, before hundreds of thousands of Vietnamese from Hanoi and all over Vietnam, Ho Chi Minh came out on behalf of the provi-

sional government to solemnly read the immortal Declaration of Independence, giving birth to the Democratic Republic of Vietnam (now the Socialist Republic of Vietnam). Inspired by the French Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen and the American Declaration of Independence, Ho Chi Minh wished for the same noble things for the Vietnamese people. In the Declaration of Independence of Vietnam, he stressed: "All the peoples on the earth are equal from birth, all the peoples have a right to live, to be happy and free. Those are undeniable truths ... Vietnam has the right to be a free and independent country, and in fact is so already. The entire Vietnamese people are determined to mobilize all their physical and mental strength, to sacrifice their lives and property in order to safeguard their independence and liberty." This immortal declaration opened up a new era for the Vietnamese people. Once again, they have the right to hold their heads up high in the pride of being citizens of a free and in-

dependent country. Today, on the Independence Day of Vietnam, each and every Vietnamese citizen is filled with pride, for Vietnam not only succeeded in preserving freedom and independence but also built a much stronger country with a much better life for its people. Vietnam started its comprehensive national reform in 1986. In the years since, the country's GDP has been growing at an average rate of 7 percent, a relatively

high growth rate in the region. GDP per capita increased 20 fold. In particular, the population living below the poverty line defined by the U.N. was reduced from 58 percent in 1993 to 8 percent in 2013. From a rice importer in the 1990s, Vietnam has now become the second-largest rice exporter in the world, with roughly 7 million tons of rice exports per year. At the same time, it is able to ensure food security for its

population of 90 million. In terms of foreign affairs, Vietnam became a member of the United Nations in 1977, 2 years after the reunification of the country in 1975. It is now a responsible member of the international community with constantly increasing international stature. Vietnam is also a member of the WTO, ASEAN, ASEM, APEC and others. The country has established diplomatic relations with almost every country around the world and is able to maintain friendly and cooperative relations with all.

For the cause of national development and defense, Vietnam has received great support from many countries around the world, including from the government and people of Japan. We sincerely thank Japan for its invaluable support. Vietnam and Japan have had

diplomatic relations for more

than 40 years, but in fact, the relationship between the two countries dates back thousands of years. Over a thousand years ago, Vietnamese Buddhist monks and followers visited Japan. Four hundred years ago, commercial activities between Vietnam and Japan were already vibrant. The traces of this intimate relationship are still found in many parts of Vietnam, especially in the town of Hoi An (Quang Nam province, central Vietnam) where many ancient Japanese-style houses and the Japanese Bridge Pagoda remain intact. Hoi An has been recognized by UNESCO as a World Heritage site and has re-

The two countries are enjoying a better-than-ever relationship. In 2009, we decided to establish a Strategic Partnership. After 5 years, Vietnam-Japan relations have been growing strongly in all areas on the basis of mutual trust and understanding. In particular, during the State Visit to Japan in March 2014 by Vietnamese President Truong Tan Sang, leaders of the two countries decided to upgrade bilateral relations to a new level, entering into an Extensive Strategic Partnership for Peace and Prosperity in Asia. Japan has become one of Vietnam's most important strategic partners that will play an essential role in Vietnam's development process in the coming years. Japan is also the largest bilateral official development assistance (ODA) donor to Vietnam. Many important infrastructure projects in Vietnam have been implemented with Japan's assistance such as the Nhat Tan Bridge in Hanoi over the Red River, Tan Son Nhat Airport International Terminal and Terminal T2 at Noi Bai Airport, Lach Huyen Port in HaiPhong and others. Vietnam is grateful for the enormous support provided by the Japanese government and people, and we are committed to using these ODA funds in the most effective way. Japan is also the largest investor in Vietnam with more than 1,310 Japanese companies operating in our country and hundreds of others ready to invest in the Vietnamese market. Our two-way trade reached \$24 billion in 2013. Japan continues to be a leading trade partner of Vietnam, and both sides can do more to maximize our

vast potential. Cooperation in culture, education, science and technology, as well as people-to-people exchanges and cooperation among localities of the two countries have been enhanced. There are over 15,000 Vietnamese students and researchers in Japan. In 2013, Vietnam received 600,000 tourists from Japan and 85,000 Vietnamese

tourists visited Japan. Vietnam always welcomes Japanese tourists to visit our country and we also encourage Vietnamese tourists to visit Japan. The number of Vietnamese tourists to Japan is expected to see multifold increases once better facilitation from Japan, especially in terms of entry visas, is implemented. Exchanges and cooperation among localities of both countries are also flourishing.

There remains huge poten-

tial for bilateral cooperation. The Industrialization Strategy for Vietnam until 2020 and its longer vision under the Vietnam-Japan Cooperation Framework and Action Plan have been adopted. Six prioritized sectors have been identified, including electronics, agricultural machinery, agriculture and aquaculture proshipbuilding, environment and energy saving, automobile manufacturing and automobile spare parts. Vietnam and Japan also agreed to implement the fifth phase of the Vietnam-Japan Joint Initiative aimed at creating a welcoming environment for Japanese companies to do business and make investments in Vietnam. Agriculture is also a promising area for mutually beneficial cooperation, especially with the two countries engaged in TPP ne-

gotiations. With the prospect of the TPP, Vietnam and Japan, rather than competing against each other, can complement each other to maximize our strengths in agriculture. There are still many other areas of great potential for mutually beneficial cooperation. We firmly believe that Vietnam and Japan, once becoming each other's reliable partners, share great interest in promoting the extensive strategic partnership.

On the occasion of the National Day of Vietnam, I wish to express the most sincere gratitude and the best wishes to His Imperial Majesty Emperor Akihito of Japan, Her Majesty Empress Michiko and other members of the Royal family, H.E.
