An important portion of the Greek-owned fleet is being built in Japanese shipyards, continuing a trend that started in the 1950s and considerably contributed to the efforts made by Japan to revitalize its economy after World War II. More than 100 vessels are currently being built in Japan with a value of at least \$8 billion.

Both our peoples share the notions of hospitality as embodied in the Greek philoxenia and the Japanese omotenashi, which have long shaped relations with outsiders, and today represent a concept that calls on all nations to come together in a spirit of respect, cooperation, and peace, an idea the ancient Greeks val-
