



other countries in the region in their strive for a more stable and secure Middle East.

Jordan is blessed with the gift of stability and security despite what the region is witnessing these days. This was possible through the strong leadership and wisdom of His Majesty King Abdullah II, along with the unwavering vigilance, and determination of our people to never allow extremism to touch their country, or the lives they built for their families, keeping Jordan a moderate and tolerant society where human rights and dignity are safeguarded, and where doors are open to millions of refugees who found in Jordan a safe haven for themselves and their loved ones.
