
Angola National Day

To further mark the occasion, a group of boys and girls from the Angolan Kaposoka Symphony Orchestra, toured Japan in May for a series of concerts in Matsumoto, Nagano Prefecture, Soma, Fukushi-Prefecture. Sendai. ma Hiroshima and Tokyo. The two countries maintain excellent bilateral relations, but there is still room to infuse a new breath to the friendly ties and tap into each other's enormous potentials.

Angola has untapped possibilities in various fields such as agriculture, agro-industry, food processing, transport, logistics, mining, tourism, services and areas where Japanese investment and technology transfer can play an important role. I would like to take this opportunity to call upon Japanese companies to invest in Angola and enjoy the wide range of state support available for investors.
