Colombia Independence Day

Celebrating the peace agreement

The celebration of the National Independence Day of the Republic of Colombia provides a suitable opportunity to commemorate Colombia's close relationship with Japan; a very

solid, rich and friendly diplomatic relationship that has, as its base, the shared values of democratic freedom, peace-building and respect for the rule of law.

On behalf of President Juan Manuel Santos and the people of Colombia, I would like to express special greetings to Their Majesties Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko, the Imperial family, Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, the members of the Japanese government, the Japanese

people and all the organizations that maintain strong ties with Colombia.

Under the leadership of our president, important steps have been taken for the establishment of a long-lasting peace. Of particular importance are the peace agreement reached in November between the government and the FARC guerrilla group and FARC's surrender of weapons under the vigilance and verification of the U.N.

The peace process has revealed the strength of Colombia's institutions and democracy where, through dialogue and democratic participation, citizens decide together the future of the country. Peace efforts have been generously supported by the international community and further recognized through the gesture of awarding the 2016 Nobel Peace Prize to our president.

Colombia is one of the world's most bio-diverse countries, rich in natural resources and known for having a stable

economy and good macroeconomic management. These characteristics, together with the recent peace agreement and social improvements such as security, poverty reduction, widening employment opportunities and equality, motivated the selection of Colombia as the country of the year by The Economist magazine in 2016 and are paving the way for Colombia to become a member of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development.

At the center of the Americas, and having coasts on the Atlantic and Pacific oceans, Colombia is a convenient logistic hub that offers great connectivity. In terms of economic potential, according to current estimates, the peace-building efforts will result in an additional 1 to 1.5 percent growth in gross domestic product and boost other areas of the economy. Moreover, the country has a dynamic and well-educated population, with more than 55 percent being less

than 30 years old.

Colombia offers a wide array of trade and investment opportunities for Japanese businesses, with two areas of particular potential being agriculture and tourism. Regarding agriculture, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the U.N. has designated Colombia among the seven countries with the highest food production potential with a predicted annual increase of 5 percent. As for tourism, between 2007 and 2016, the industry has grown at an average of 12.7 percent, while the global average stands at 3.9 percent, according to the World Tourism Organization. Moreover, foreign visitors and foreign investment in hotels and tourism-related activities have seen increased numbers. For the year 2017, Lonely Planet designated Colombia as the second-most preferred destination worldwide.

The economic partnership agreement and double taxation agreement, two bilateral mechanisms currently under negotiation, are expected to further enhance current economic opportunities. Furthermore, Japan and the Asia-Pacific region are of high priority to Colombia.

Concrete steps are being taken to improve Colombia's presence in the region, a good example being The Pacific Alliance; one of the platforms through which Colombia is fortifying ties with Asia and where Japan is playing an important role as an observer.

The commemoration of independence is an excellent occasion to express the interest of the Colombian government to continue working with Japan to invigorate the friendly relations between our countries and to express gratitude to Japan and the international community for their constant support and commitment throughout the peace-building process.


