Guinea celebrates today its 60th anniversary of independence, won at the price of many sacrifices and struggles, for which cooperation with Japan plays a very decisive role. In this regard, the past year has given a new impetus to the cooperation between Guinea and Japan, crystallized by the opening of a Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) office in Conakry.

JICA, which specializes in the fields of fishery, agriculture, education, health, infrastructure, water and sanitation, can not only boost actions on the ground, but also ensure the

transfer of transformative knowledge. IICA's activities in Guinea will revolve around the PNDES (National Plan for Economic and Social Development), which targets the sectors of food security, the strengthening of the economic development base, as well as human capital development. Another highlight of cooperation between Guinea and Japan is the Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD), an initiative launched in 1993 by the government of Japan to promote a high-level political dialogue between African leaders and their partners. Through this initiative, the government of Japan is promoting the dialogue as well as helping mobilize support for development initiatives that are designed by Africans themselves.

Today, TICAD represents one of the most favorable global frameworks to facilitate the implementation of measures to promote the development of Africa according to the dual principle of "ownership" by Africa and "international partnership."

Also in the framework of the cooperation between Guinea and Japan, it is necessary to stress the current dynamics of development



initiated by the government under our president's initiative, which aims to encourage the promotion of innovative financing such as foreign direct investment to share the fruit of growth and further develop sectors with high economic potential. Thus, Guinea, which has significant mining and hydroelectric potential, wishes to count on the valuable support of both the Japanese public and private sector to enable the realization of its vast development project.
