Croatian Statehood Day is celebrated on May 30 on the inauguration date of the first multiparty parliament in 1990. After regaining its independence in 1991 and winning the

Homeland War after a four-year struggle for freedom, a new chapter of our history began. Today, Croatia, as a member of NATO and the European Union, is providing assistance to the maximum of its resources to those in need, particularly to our Ukrainian friends.

In Croatia as well as many other countries, the Japanese have become a subject of admiration and a source of inspiration for their resilience in difficult times. For many years, the Japanese and Croatian peoples have shared friendship, sympathy and solidarity both in good and bad times, from the Croatian Homeland War and the 3/11 Great East Japan Earthquake and tsunami to the earthquakes that

rocked Zagreb and areas around our capital in 2020 for the first time in 140 years.

Even though the Tokyo Olympics and Paralympics were held almost a year ago, I have to praise the extraordinary organization of the Games despite the extremely challenging circumstances. Croatian athletes won eight medals, with the most exciting for us being the final of the men's tennis doubles, which involved Croatia versus Croatia.

Croatia is committed to strengthening and deepening economic ties with Japan. There is huge potential for increasing our bilateral trade, investments and joint projects in third countries. The Croatian Embassy in Japan will continue to work diligently toward the full use of that potential.
