Despite the challenges of COVID-19, we are currently accepting tourists from all over the world without any complications with documents or other pandemicrelated restrictions, and our embassy in Japan is ready to support Japanese travel agencies in raising awareness about our country.

On this celebratory occasion let me wish peace and prosperity to the people of Japan and all the readers of The Japan Times.
