throughout its territory, which encourages the arrival of tourists, the country's main economic sector. Cuba was able to develop five vaccines

of its own for the vaccination of its entire population over 2 years of age and in solidarity with other countries in the world that do not have access to them. I wish to reiterate the special gratitude

of all Cubans and their government for the traditional expressions of solidarity with Cuba, from friendly organizations, members of parliament, political parties and Japanese society in general.
