

On the occasion of the 126th anniversary of the Proclamation of Philippine Independence, I extend my warmest greetings to our friends and fellow Filipinos in Japan. For the past

126 years, the Philippines has championed freedom and democracy, navigating through various challenges while weaving meaningful connections across the globe.

Under the banner of "Bagong Pilipinas" ("New Philippines"), our nation has embarked on a journey of transformation, marked by a renewed sense of identity and purpose. Together, the Philippine government and Filipino people are striving to propel our country to upper-middle-income status by 2025, with the overarching goal of ensuring a comfortable and secure life for all Filipinos.

Japan holds a special place in this ongoing journey of the Filipino people. The Land of the Rising Sun has been our close friend and valued partner in the Indo-Pacific region for more than six decades.

In the past 15 months, the Philippines and Japan have strengthened cooperation, building a truly strategic partnership — one that enters into erstwhile unexplored, but potentially transformative, areas of cooperation. Our joint efforts on issues such as climate change, infrastructure development, cybersecurity and space affairs have not only complemented long-standing areas of cooperation, but also opened new avenues for mutual progress and security.

Japan has consistently been a top source of official development assistance and foreign investment for the Philippines. In 2023, Japan's support for Philippine economic development was worth nearly \mathbb{\text{\$}}800 billion, which exceeded the original amount

of ODA and private investments pledged at the beginning of last year. This substantial support from the Japanese government and Japan Inc. has been channeled into impactful projects aimed at improving our mass transport system, enhancing disaster resilience and promoting environmental sustainability, among others.

All of these help drive the Philippines along its trajectory of transformation into a green, digitized, connected, innovative, smart and inclusive economy.

Japan has also been a key partner in our pursuit for a just and lasting peace in Mindanao. Japan has stood by the Philippines in consolidating and building on the gains from the decade of peace since the Comprehensive Agreement on the Bangsamoro was signed in April 2014. In commemorating the 10th anniversary of the signing of the CAB, President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr., stated: "Peace is totally achieved not when the sound of gunfire has ceased. It is when the clamor for better lives has been met." With Japan's generous assistance in community normalization and development initiatives, the Philippines is making great strides in uplifting the lives of its citizens in the Bangsamoro region.

On defense and security, our cooperation has never been stronger.

As archipelagic and maritime nations, the Philippines and Japan have been working closely together to keep vital sea lanes free, open and safe. The provision of radars, capacity-building and other assets by Japan, through its official security assistance program, has significantly bolstered our maritime domain awareness capabilities. These endeavors are founded on our shared dedication to building a rules-based international order, especially in the global commons, and our unwavering belief that disputes among nations must be resolved through peaceful means, in accordance with international law.

The Philippines remains resolute in upholding the principles of peace, equity and justice, both at home and on the international stage. In Japan, we have found a reliable and trusted partner whose record

in advancing international humanitarian law, human rights and nonproliferation has greatly contributed to international peace and stability. Our countries stand as advocates for responsible global citizenship that embraces humanity's collective duty to foster cooperation, cultivate compassion and strive for the common good.

Extending our bilateral endeavors to trilateral and multilateral frameworks is the next logical step in the evolution of our partnership. The Philippines and Japan actively engage with other like-minded partners to amplify our efforts and achieve greater impact in addressing regional and global issues. The Joint Vision Statement resulting from the historic trilateral Philippines-Japan-U.S. summit reflects the partners' determination to tackle economic, security, technological and other cross-cutting challenges through concerted actions.

At the heart of our ties are the Filipino and Japanese peoples.

The enduring friendship between Filipinos and Japanese is anchored on shared, powerful values. With a vibrant 300,000-strong Filipino community in Japan, thriving two-way tourism and robust educational exchange programs, our people-to-people ties continue to flourish. We thank Japan for providing a safe and welcoming home to our nationals. The Filipinos who are living, studying and working in Japan are our de facto ambassadors of goodwill. Their invaluable contributions to both our economies and societies form part of the solid foundation upon which our strategic partnership firmly stands.

Today, as we proudly commemorate the birth of Asia's first republic, we reflect on the achievements of the past as we blaze a path toward a promising horizon. *Mabuhay ang kalayaan at ang bagong Pilipinas* (Long live our freedom and the New Philippines)!
