In this regard, Cote d'Ivoire enjoys a long-standing friendship and fruitful cooperative relations with Japan, as 2025 will mark the 65th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between our countries.


This excellent relationship is being further reinforced, as illustrated by the recent visit to Cote d'Ivoire by Japan's Foreign Affairs Minister Yoko Kamikawa, who focused on strengthening economic cooperation during the occasion.

The dynamism of the cooperation is also reflected in the entry into force on March 26, 2021, of the Agreement on the Reciprocal Promotion and Protection of Investments between Japan and Cote d'Ivoire, as well as in the renewed interest expressed by the Japanese public and private sectors in our country.

In February, several Japanese delegations visited Cote d'Ivoire, including the vice minister of finance, a business mission of 26 Japanese company directors led by the executive vice president of the Japan External Trade Organization, a delegation from the Finance Ministry and a delegation from the Japan Bank for International Cooperation.

To consolidate this positive momentum, Japan is supporting the Ivorian government's efforts to ensure a more favorable investment environment. Therefore, Cote d'Ivoire is creating incentives for the private sector and Japanese investments within the Ivorian economy, one of the most efficient in Africa.

The Ivorian authorities, under the leadership of the president, are firmly pursuing structural and sectoral reforms to improve governance, sound management of public

In this perspective and in line with the Tunis Declaration, Cote d'Ivoire is honored to take an active role in the activities of the ninth Tokyo International Conference on African Develpment, namely the ministerial meeting on Aug. 24 and 25 the summit in August 2025.

Cote d'Ivoire will also attend the 2025 World Expo in Osaka, for which the participation contract was signed on June 25, on the sidelines of the fourth International Planning Meeting of the Expo 2025 Organization, held from June 24 to 28 in Nara.

I sincerely hope that the continuation of exchanges at various levels and the TICAD process will enable Cote d'Ivoire and Japan

to strengthen relations between our public and private sectors and raise our ties of friendship and cooperation to the highest




