The savings from bond interest payments are reinvested in climate-smart agriculture initiatives. As a major food supplier, Uruguay aims to enhance livestock productivity while reducing the sector's emissions intensity.

Globally, Uruguay excels in environmental, social and governance fundamentals, achieving top scores in internationally recognized ESG rankings. With 98% of our electricity generated from renewable sources, Uruguay is at the forefront of environmental policies and energy transition, ranking first in the Energy Transition Index among emerging countries. Our commitment to decarbonization and improvements in climate efficiency in livestock and cattle production further under-
