## Creating a robust legal system RYUII KOIZUMI

I would like to extend my heartfelt congratulations to the Socialist Republic of Vietnam on its 79th Independence Day anniversary.

This year also marks the 30th anniversary of the commencement of Japan's legal technical cooperation with Vietnam. In 1994, Vietnam sought to establish a new legal system to accelerate its economic transition. Based upon Vietnam's request, Japan's Justice Ministry organized a training course inviting Vietnamese judicial officials to Japan. Two years later, a project by the Japan International Cooperation Agency for legal technical cooperation launched. The International Cooperation Department of the Research and Training Institute of

the Justice Ministry has continuously supported JICA projects, resulting in many notable achievements, such as the amendment of Vietnam's Civil Code and the enactment of the Code of Civil Procedure.

Throughout a variety of activities, Japan's experts have engaged in close dialogue with their Vietnamese counterparts to explore the most suitable legal system for Vietnam, rather than adhering to introducing any specific legal system. We have taken such an approach to emphasize the importance of standing by our partner countries to help them achieve their goals. I believe this approach earned trust from our Vietnamese counterparts.

In November 2023, Japan-Vietnam relations were elevated to a comprehensive strategic partnership by the adoption of a joint statement. Built on the longstanding history of our collaboration and friendship, I sincerely hope that we will further develop our relationship in the field of law and justice in the coming decades toward peace and prosperity in Asia and around the world.




