# Celebrating 71 years of long-lasting relations, partnership

Cambodia, a land of rich culture and history, commemorates its Independence Day with great enthusiasm and pride every Nov. 9. This significant day symbolizes the country's dec-

laration of independence from France in 1953 under the royal crusade of His Majesty the late King Preah Borom Ratanak Kaudh Norodom Sihanouk, the father of independence.

This year signifies the 71st anniversary of Cambodia's Independence Day, reminding us of the courageous movement for national unity initiated by the late king, who selflessly dedicated himself to securing independence for the nation.

Throughout its history, Cambodia has encountered numerous challenges, from the utmost Sangkum Reastr Niyum (Popular Socialist Community) to the Khmer Rouge genocide regime and civil wars. The Cambodian people deeply appreciate the tireless efforts of Samdech Techo Hun Sen, former prime minister and current president of the senate, for his initiative on the Win-Win Policy that led to the complete cessation of civil war, unification and lasting peace in Cambodia on Dec. 29, 1998.

Under the dynamic leadership of Samdech Moha Borvor Thipadei Hun Manet, prime minister of Cambodia, the government of the seventh legislature has attained remarkable milestones, particularly in upholding peace, political stability, economic growth and development and a notable increase in investment and environmental activities, while safeguarding national sovereignty and territorial integrity. Cambodia has actually transitioned from being classified as a least-developed country to a low-middle-income country,

and is preparing a strategy to exit LDC status entirely by 2029. The groundbreaking for the Funan Techo Canal held on Aug. 5 is one of the most important projects in Cambodian history. Looking to the future, the government aims to achieve high-middle-income status by 2030 and high-income status by 2050.

To achieve sustainable and inclusive growth as outlined in the Cambodian government's Pentagonal Strategies, the government has set policies to fortify old friendships, cultivate new friendships and solidify Cambodia's position on the international stage by further enhancing development partnership and cooperation.

This year also marks the 70th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Cambodia and Japan. In his congratulatory message to Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba on Oct. 1, Manet highlighted the excellent bonds of friendship and close bilateral ties enjoyed by Cambodia and Japan, underpinned by frequent high-level exchanges and practical cooperation in multiple fields, and reaffirmed Cambodia's readiness

to work and cooperate closely with Japan. The commitment to further reinforce the aforementioned framework has been reaffirmed through a constructive telephone conversation between Deputy Prime Minister Sok Chenda Sophea, the minister of foreign affairs and international cooperation of Cambodia, and newly appointed Foreign Minister of Japan Takeshi Iwaya, on Oct. 21. Both sides reaffirmed their shared resolve to further strengthen the comprehensive strategic partnership between the two countries, which has paved the way for deepening and expanding cooperation in mutually beneficial sectors, including Japan's Three New Cooperation Approaches with Cambodia, aligning with Cambodia's development strategy, the Pentagonal Strategy Phase I for five years.

Iwaya also expressed his commitment to further promote the existing excellent cooperation, including in trade and investment, education, health, defense and security, demining and connectivity.

This year, both countries have conducted frequent communication and high-level visits to promote a strong foundation for bilateral cooperation in all areas, including official visits to Cambodia by then-Foreign Minister Yoko Kamikawa and then-Defense Minister Minoru Kihara

on July 5 to 6 and Aug. 5, respectively, contributing to the strengthening and expansion of the existing good cooperation in many fields.

Trade has steadily increased as well. In the first seven months of 2024, the bilateral trade volume between Cambodia and Japan reached more than \$1.15 billion, while Japan provided the highest number of visitors to Cambodia among the top 10 countries.

Cambodia and Japan also reaffirm their commitment to further strengthen cooperation in the regional and international arenas. Cambodia appreciates and welcomes Japan's strong determination to further reinforce the relationship with the Association of Southeast Asian Nations under the comprehensive strategic partnership confirmed by Ishiba at the 27th ASEAN-Japan summit in Vientiane on Oct. 10.

In conclusion, I would like to express Cambodia's sincere gratitude to the government and people of Japan for their significant contribution to Cambodia's peace process in the past and for providing valuable assistance to Cambodia's socioeconomic rehabilitation and development,

May the enduring friendship between Cambodia and Japan continue to prosper.

From independence up to the present day, your country has continued to achieve great development. I would like to express my respect for your country's record of steady devel-


opment and for the efforts of the Cambodian people, and I pray for your country's further prosperity.




