

Toward an ever-brighter future

On behalf of the Japan-Qatar Friendship Association, I would like to extend my congratulations to the Amir of the State of Qatar His Highness Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani and the

people of the State of Qatar on their 53rd National Day anniversary.

The JQFA was established in 1976 with the aim of deepening friendship and goodwill between Qatar and Japan and promoting economic cooperation and cultural exchanges. The association currently has 42 active corporate members.

Although there is a distance of about 8,000 kilometers between Qatar and Japan, the friendly relationship between our countries has lasted for over 50 years, and we are deeply connected in a wide range of fields. For our country, your nation truly is a "distant yet close country."

For nearly five years until last year, former Ambassador of the State of Qatar to Japan His Excellency Hassan Mohammed Rafi Al-Emadi worked tirelessly to promote friendship between our countries. This year marks the beginning of a new chapter

with the arrival of the new ambassador, His Excellency Jaber Jarallah Al-Marri, who succeeded Al-Emadi.

The JQFA has had the honor of having successive ambassadors of Qatar serve as our honorary chairmen. We are pleased to welcome Al-Maari as our new honorary chairman. We held a welcoming reception in his honor, celebrating his appointment and deepening exchanges with our members.

The air route that serves as a bridge between Qatar and Japan began in 2005 with the launch of Qatar Airways' Doha-Kansai flights. Although the Doha-Kansai flights were suspended in 2016, they were revived in March, marking their return after a long absence. Together with the flights to Narita and Haneda, we now have a three-route system similar to that during the peak period.

Furthermore, starting in February, Narita flights will increase to 11 from seven per week, which is expected to further stimulate business demand and support the strong inbound demand.

In November, I visited Ras Laffan in the north of Qatar. This is the place where the Qatar liquefied natural gas project began about 30 years ago, thanks to the close cooperation between the State of Qatar and Japan. During my visit this time, I witnessed construction on the site of Qatar Energy's LNG expansion project. This project aims to expand Qatar's LNG production capacity

from the current 77 million tons per year to ultimately 142 million tons per year.

Even in today's world where carbon neutrality is being called for, LNG, which is low in carbon, is indispensable for a stable energy supply. The importance of LNG is increasing due to energy security concerns and the rapid rise in electricity demand driven by artificial intelligence and data centers. I would like to express my respect for the wise leaders of the State of Qatar, who are making solid progress in increasing LNG production during this time.

Qatar and Japan, as invaluable partners, will build stronger cooperative relations by deepening exchanges not only in the energy sector, but also in areas such as education, culture, health care and sports, based on the relationships we have established so far.

The JQFA will strive to further cooperate and contribute to Qatar's bright future by working closely with the staff of the Embassy of Qatar in Japan.

In conclusion, I extend my most sincere congratulations on Qatar's continued prosperity and development under the superior leadership of the sheikh and pray that our relationship of mutual trust will continue to develop further.
