On the 50th anniversary of the independence of the Republic of Mozambique, we would like to reaffirm the historical and strategic ties with Japan, in a partnership marked by solidar-

ity, innovation and a shared vision for the future.

In this landmark year, as Mozambique celebrates half a century of national independence, we also proudly mark 48 years of diplomatic relations with Japan. This is a friendship that transcends borders, languages and oceans, uniting two nations committed to progress and cooperation. The historical relationship between Mozambique and Japan dates back centuries through cultural and economic contacts, but it has gained new momentum with the strong diplomatic partnership built since 1977.

Today, we celebrate more than a formal bond. We celebrate a deep partnership founded on dialogue, mutual trust and solidarity.

Over the past decades, Japan has been a strategic partner in Mozambique's development, contributing significantly to key infrastructure projects such as the modernization of the Port of Nacala, the construction of the Combined Cycle Thermal Power Plant in Maputo, and the exploitation of liquefied natural gas in the Rovuma Basin. Also noteworthy is the Mphanda Nkuwa Hydroelectric Dam project, which positions Mozambique as a key player in the region's energy transition and provides green energy to Southern Africa and the Indo-Pacific.

At the heart of this cooperation is the

important role played by the Japan International Cooperation Agency, which has driven Mozambique's economic and social growth through structural development projects and the training of thousands of Mozambican youth, the country's most renewable and transformative resource. Mozambique's participation in Expo 2025, under the theme "Empowering Lives," symbolizes this shared ambition. The sub-theme of "Education and Work through Artificial Intelligence and Robotics" illustrates how, alongside Japan, the

country is turning challenges into opportunities, aligning with the U.N. sustainable development goals and preparing for the post-2030 agenda.


The Tokyo International Conference on African Development constitutes an important pillar of our relationship, with its ninth edition scheduled for Aug. 20 to 22 in Yokohama. Mozambique has been a prominent partner within the TICAD framework, advocating for sustainable development and focusing on topics such as energy transition, infrastructure development and human capital enhancement. This multilateral platform reinforces Japan's commitment to the African continent and opens new windows of opportunity for investment, innovation and technical cooperation.

The future of Mozambique-Japan relations is projected with optimism and ambition. By strengthening areas such as human development, agriculture and renewable energy, and with the growing presence of Japanese companies in strategic sectors, a joint path is being built toward inclusive, resilient and sustainable development.
