develop clean energy solutions. Our participation at the Osaka Expo allows us to share this commitment with the world.

When it comes to food, Uruguay is proud to offer premium products. Our beef is carefully produced with strict controls and full traceability, meeting the highest standards globally. Uruguay progressively gained the trust of Japanese consumers and, within a couple of years of opening its market to Uruguayan beef, became the sixth-largest foreign supplier. Other products, including olive oil, caviar, dairy and fine wines, also enjoy recognition here. Beyond food, we're excited about artisanal products like beautiful garments made from premium natural wool, combining tradition with modern design. Our jewelry and decorative pieces made from local agates and amethysts are also making their mark with Japanese customers who appreciate unique craftsmanship.

Tourism is another exciting part of our relationship. Uruguay offers stunning Atlantic beaches, UNESCO World Heritage Sites, soothing thermal springs and vibrant cultural scenes — all in a safe, welcoming setting. With sustainable tourism policies
