Strong ties built on robust cooperation, high-level visits

Every Nov. 9, Cambodians celebrate Independence Day at the Independence Monument, where the lighting of the victory flame symbolizes Cambodia's freedom and sovereignty.

Such an auspicious occasion marks the nation's liberation from French colonial rule under the royal crusade of His Majesty the late King Preah Borom Ratanak Kaudh Norodom Sihanouk, the king-father of independence. Over the past 72 years, the courageous movement for national unity initiated by the late king has remained a significant memory for the Cambodian people.

Cambodia has a tragic history marked by coups, civil war and genocide in the 1970s. The hard-earned peace that Former Prime Minister Samdech Techo Hun Sen obtained under the successful Win-Win Policy in 1998 has been continuously safeguarded. This policy ended decades of conflict and has laid a foundation for sustainable peace through national reconciliation, unity and development.

Before the pandemic, our economy grew at an annual rate of around 7%. Current projections for gross domestic product growth are 5.2% for 2025 and 5.0% for 2026, positioning Cambodia to graduate from least-developed country status by 2029. Through this development, millions of people will have been lifted out of poverty.

Each year, millions of international tourists, including investors, visit Cambodia. The seventh legislature, led by the Prime Minister Samdech Moha Borvor Thipadei Hun Manet, has worked tirelessly to accelerate socioeconomic growth, guided by its Pentagonal Strategy-Phase I, and drive development toward

the national vision of becoming a highincome country by 2050.

The Cambodian government and people extended their deepest gratitude to U.S. President Donald Trump for his decisive leadership in supporting lasting peace, and to Malaysian Prime Minister Dato' Seri Anwar Ibrahim, in his capacity as chair of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations, for his unwavering support in facilitating the peaceful resolution of the Cambodia-Thailand border conflict. This led to the official signing of the Cambodia-Thailand Peace Deal by Manet and Prime Minister Anutin Charnvirakul on Oct. 26 in Kuala Lumpur, witnessed by Trump and the Malaysian prime minister.

We are also deeply grateful to the ASEAN member states, China, Japan and other partners, who have supported the ceasefire from the very beginning.

Cambodia and Japan have consistently maintained enduring relations, underpinned by frequent high-level visits and robust cooperation across a wide range of sectors. This year marks the 72nd anniversary of diplomatic relations, and during the successful official visit of Manet to Japan in late May, the prime ministers of both countries reaffirmed commitment to strengthening their comprehensive strategic partnership, a new milestone reached in 2023.

They also adopted the Economic Co-Creation Package as a platform to attract more Japanese investors to Cambodia, strengthen trade and lay a solid foundation for future cooperation. Cambodia's relationship with Japanese legislative institutions was also reinforced.

The affirmation to further deepen the Cambodia-Japan partnership has been assured through the separate congratulatory letters from the Senate President Hun Sen and Manet on Sanae Takaichi's election as prime minister.

We extend our warmest congratulations on Japan's successful hosting of the Osaka Expo, and are pleased that the Cambodia Pavilion won the prestigious Bronze Award for Exhibition Design at the event.

Furthermore, bilateral relations have been further reaffirmed through the congratulatory letter from Deputy Prime Minister Prak Sokhonn, minister of foreign affairs and international cooperation, to Toshimitsu Motegi, minister of foreign affairs.

Japan ranked as Cambodia's fourth-largest trading partner for the first nine months of this year after logging \$1.87 billion in trade, up 17% from the same period in 2024. We highly value the Japanese private sector, noting that from 1994 to 2025, Japanese corporate investment in 154 projects in Cambodia amounted to \$2.94 billion (roughly ¥452.4 billion).


New developments, including Sihanoukville Port development, the fourfloor Techo International Airport opening and Air Cambodia's commencement of a new direct flight route, are expected to enhance connectivity, promote tourism and contribute to fostering deeper cultural and economic ties between our nations.

Cooperation in the defense sector has strengthened significantly as well. Our strengthening cooperation in regional and international arenas has been reaffirmed for the mutual benefit of both nations and for the advancement of peace, stability and prosperity in our region and beyond.

Cambodia is the first country in the ASEAN region to publicly support Japan's "Free and Open Indo-Pacific Strategy." Most recently, the 28th ASEAN-Japan Summit in Malaysia reaffirmed our commitment to advancing the ASEAN-Japan comprehensive strategic partnership.

Finally, I would like to extend Cambodia's heartfelt gratitude to the government and people of Japan for their significant contributions to Cambodia's peace process in the 1990s, and their invaluable assistance to Cambodia's socioeconomic development.

May the enduring Cambodia-Japan friendship continue to prosper.

I also offer congratulations on the grand opening of Techo International Airport. Upon landing at the new airport recently, I was once again astonished by the speed of Cambodia's growth.

Minebea Mitsumi has been a pioneer-

ing electronic components manufacturer in Cambodia since launching Minebea (Cambodia) Co. in December 2010. Our precision business has expanded steadily, with the Phnom Penh factory growing to 200,000 square meters of floor space. This first factory now provides employment opportunities for 9,000 Cambodians, an increase of 2,000 people from last year.

The second factory in Pursat province, for which we held a groundbreaking ceremony last September with many distinguished guests, began operations in October as planned.

We also plan to start power generation in December at the large solar plant we are building in Pursat province. The electricity generated at this plant will be enough to cover our business activities. This means the products we produce in Cambodia will be made with 100% renewable energy.

We plan to continue creating new businesses and expanding our 30 megawattscale solar power generation business in Cambodia. We want to place a strong

emphasis on contributing especially to the people of Pursat province and their communities, as they are supporting our new

We currently have 172 colleagues from Pursat who are undergoing overseas training. We want to grow the precision machine parts industry, which is in its infancy in Cambodia, to its full potential and give Cambodia's younger generation the opportunity to compete globally. We hope they feel a sense of confidence and joy from that experience. It would be our greatest pleasure to create these opportunities.

Thanks to the unprecedented support from the Royal Government of Cambodia and the efforts of our Cambodian employees, these new business expansions are now possible. We will continue to contribute to the further development of Cambodia.

Again, I cordially extend my heartfelt wishes of prosperity and happiness to the Kingdom of Cambodia.

During the forum, a memorandum of cooperation was signed between the Cam-




