

Egypt National Day Special

Preserving the past, shaping the future

For millennia, Egypt has occupied a singular place in human history. Home to one of the world's oldest continuous civilizations, it has shaped architecture, science, writing and governance in ways that continue to influence humanity today. While its ancient monuments remain timeless symbols of human achievement, modern Egypt is equally committed to preserving this heritage and presenting it to future generations through innovation, research and international cooperation.

Among Egypt's enduring landmarks, none is more universally recognized than the Giza Plateau. Designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1979, it is home to the Great Pyramid of Khufu — the last of the Seven Wonders of the World — as well as the pyramids of Khafre and Menkaure and the iconic Great Sphinx. Their influence has transcended geography and time, inspiring generations of scholars, architects and travelers from around the world.

Today, this extraordinary legacy enters a new chapter through the Grand Egyptian

Museum. Built adjacent to the Giza Pyramids, the GEM is among the largest archaeological facilities in the world dedicated to a single civilization. More than a museum, it represents a global center for heritage preservation, archaeological research, education and cultural exchange. For the first time, visitors can experience the complete collection of King Tutankhamen's treasures displayed together in one location, alongside tens of thousands of artifacts spanning more than 5,000 years.

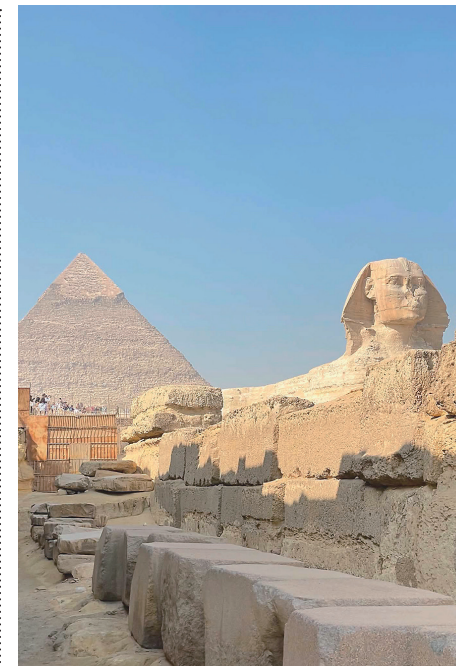
The museum also stands as one of the most successful examples of international cultural cooperation. Its realization has been supported by decades of close collaboration between Egypt and Japan, particularly through the Japan International Cooperation Agency. This partnership extends well beyond infrastructure financing to encompass conservation science, museum management, archaeological expertise and professional capacity-building.

Egypt's historical legacy extends far beyond Giza. More than a hundred pyra-

mid sites, countless temples, monasteries, mosques, archaeological cities and cultural landscapes bear witness to successive civilizations that flourished along the Nile. Together, they tell a story of innovation, resilience and cultural continuity spanning a period of over 5,000 years.

Egypt's National Day, commemorating the revolution of July 23, 1952, provides an opportunity to reflect not only on the country's modern statehood, but also on its continuing journey of development. Egypt continues to invest in education, scientific research, sustainable development and international partnerships, ensuring that its rich heritage remains a source of knowledge, dialogue and inspiration for generations to come.

As Egypt welcomes visitors, it offers more than a journey into the past. It offers an encounter with a living civilization — one where ancient monuments, vibrant culture and ambitious national development coexist, linking one of humanity's oldest histories with its shared future.

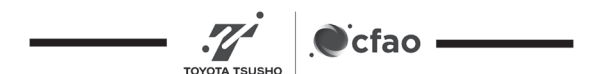
