Qatar is emerging as one of the most dynamic economies in the Middle East. It has the highest per capita income in the world and enjoys one of the fastest-growing gross domestic product rates, reaching 13.3 percent real GDP, and valued in 2008 at over \$80 billion. According to a World Economic Forum 2008-2009 report, the country is now the most competitive Arab economy, ranking 26th worldwide.

The economy is rapidly expanding in practically every sector and industry. A combination of government investment and the participation of multinational companies is creating a culture of opportunity.

The government is using its vast oil and gas wealth to create a society that provides opportunities for all. It has committed over \$140 billion for investment, infrastructure and expansion in a wide range of sectors, including energy, health, education, transport, infrastructure and tourism.

Reliance on crude oil exports has been replaced by an ambitious and progressive approach to the management of the nation's economy, which focuses on developing Qatar's huge natural gas reserves and its expansion of liquefied natural gas, petrochemical and condensate production. This is supported by a far-reaching program of economic liberalization and diversification into a more broadly based economy.

Qatar is quickly becoming the world's single largest producer of LNG and by 2010 will have a production capacity of

77 million tons per year. In 2006. Qatar overtook Malaysia as the world's largest exporter of LNG. In addition, gas-to-liquids (GTL) exports began in 2007; liquid petroleum gas (LPG) exports are increasing and Qatar aims to become one of the top five petrochemical producers in the world by 2012. New oil capacity also continues to come onstream, thus boosting export volumes. By 2012, Qatar will be producing the equivalent of 6 million barrels of oil

Qatar and Education

On the education front, Qatar is devoted to developing itself toward a knowledgebased society to enrich the level of its human capital and improve its long-term competitive advantage.

This year, Qatar Foundation for Education, Science and Community Development held the World Innovation Summit for Education (WISE) in November in Doha. WISE is a global, groundbreaking, collaborative initiative established by the nonprofit Qatar Foundation under the patronage of Her Highness Sheikha Moza Bint Nasser Al Missned, WISE seeks to monitor and contribute to 21st century challenges and their impact on education. WISE is a unique global event whose ambition is to create a new international multidisciplinary platform to shape education models for the 21st century. During this summit, opinion leaders and decision makers from around the world came together with education experts and shared their visions through open and insightful discussions.

As the idea of WISE shows, the country is transforming into an oasis of knowledge and education with the establishment of the Qatar Foundation to train local talents in order to meet the challenges of an ever-changing world. The Virginia Commonwealth University School of the Arts in Qatar, established in 1997, was the first branch campus in Education City, followed by Weill Cornell Medical College (2002), Texas A&M University (2003), Carnegie Mellon University (2004), Georgetown University School of Foreign Service (2005) and Northwestern University (2008).

Sports are part of Qatar's rich culture and heritage. Qatar aims to build a reputation in sports through its worldclass facilities and cuttingedge academy ASPIRE, which provides training for future world-champion athletes.

With \$2.8 billion investment in sporting infrastructure, Qatar successfully hosted the 15th Asian Games in 2006. Today, Qatar has nine major multipurpose sports venues and more than 15 additional specialized sports venues. According to a global contest organized by the International Association for Sports and Leisure Facilities, ASPIRE Dome and Khalifa Stadium in Doha are ranked as the second- and third-best sports facilities in the world. Therefore, Qatar has confirmed its readiness to bid to be the host of the Summer Olympic Games in 2020, the biggest multisports event in the world. Furthermore, Qatar is bid-

ding to become a host nation of the 2022 World Cup in soccer (www.qatar2022bid.com). If Qatar is granted such an honor, the state will be the first nation in the Middle East to show the region's passion for soccer to the world. With state-of-art facilities and having excellent knowhow for hosting international sports events in the past, Qatar waits to offer oncein-a-lifetime soccer experiences for fans from around the

Museum of Islamic Art

Last year, the Museum of Islamic Art (MIA) opened in Doha. Due to the integrity of traditional design principles that use indigenous materials and contemporary technologies that have created familiar, functional and environmentally suitable architecture. M̃IA was awarded "Overall Project of the Year" at the Second Annual Middle East Architect Awards.

Furthermore, the Museum of Islamic Art Education Center opened in October this year to demonstrate the vision and commitment of the State of Qatar to the international cultural and museum sector. The facilities of the center include a library that contains 10,000

titles of Islamic art, classrooms, workshops and a computer lab. Thus, the center is designed to provide a platform to art scholars from around the world to exchange ideas about their research subjects. The other objective of the center is to educate members of the community by involving them in interesting activities pertaining to Islamic art.

The vision of a new Qatar goes beyond energy developments. The government of the State of Qatar earmarked \$17 billion for tourism for the next 5 years. Initiatives are being undertaken to stimulate the construction of new high-class hotels, resorts, condominiums, restaurants, museums and leisure facilities at unprecedented levels. The number of passengers using Doha International Airport has increased from 2 million to 10 million over the past 10 years. To respond to increasing passengers, the New Doha International Airport (NDIA), the first of its kind to be designed for accommodating Airbus A380 aircraft, will handle 50 million passengers per year when construction is completed by 2015. NDIA will transform Qatar into a leading aviation center in the region.

Bilateral relations The Qatar-Japan bilateral relationship is being enhanced on the foundation of mutual cooperation and common interests. Qatar is a trustworthy supplier of oil and natural gas to Japan. In 2008, Japan bought 54 percent of Qatar's total oil exports and 21.4 percent of its total LNG exports, thus making Qatar the one of biggest energy suppliers to Japan. Qatar is also benefiting from Japanese investment in various projects and the contribution of Japanese experts in Qatari industries. This year, Japanese direct investment in Qatar totaled \$550 million. Currently, there are more than 30 Japanese companies operating in Qatar that focus on the construction, shipping and energy sectors.

Economic relations between the countries continue to be strong. Japan has been the No. 1 trade partner for Qatar over the past few years. Last year, Qatar's highest value of exports and its thirdhighest value of imports were transacted with Japan. Trade relations also grew in scale with the value of trade, leaping from \$7.6 billion in 2004 to \$28.2 billion in 2008

This year, the State of Qatar and Japan have made significant progress in developing bilateral relations through various opportunities. For instance, His Highness Sheikh Tamim Bin Hamad Al-Thani, heir apparent of the State of Qatar, made an official working visit to Japan in May this year. His Highness had an imperial audience with His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, held talks with then Prime Minister Taro Aso and many other high-ranking officials of the government of Japan and further strengthened solid Qatar-Japan bilateral ties.

Meanwhile in Doha, a Japanese school opened last May thanks to the initiatives by the leaders of the State of Qatar and Japan. During official visit to Qatar in May 2007, then Prime Minister Shinzo Abe showed his commitment as the leader of the Japanese government tinitiative by His Highness Sheikh Hamad Bin Khalifa Al-Thani, the emir of the State of Qatar, who had requested Japan for cooperation to establish a Japanese school where Qatari students receive Japanese-style education since His Highness visited Japan in 1999. Another reason for opening the Japanese school in Doha is to response to the increasing number of Japanese citizens in Qatar. It is expected that Qatari and Japanese students who learn in this

school will gain a better understanding of the people in our countries.

In addition, next year will open a new page for Qatar and Japan. Qatar Airways is

scheduled to start direct flights between Doha and Narita International Airport from March 2010 as a result of talks between civil aviation authorities of the two countries in August 2008. As a fivestar awarded airline, Qatar Airways continues to pursue excellence in customer service and promote the country's image.
