





Flood-affected require more help

Against a natural calamity, we only learn about the fragility of our capacity. The only thing we can do is to manage its aftereffects by saving as many lives as we can, preventing those who were spared from the calamity from becoming victim to diseases and by rehabilitating their lives as early as possible. Early rehabilitation will neither bring back the lost ones nor undo the damage done, but it would enable those who survived to once again stand on their feet.

Pakistan has been hit by the heaviest rains and unprecedented floods in 80 years. It has led to a tragic loss of human lives and crops besides widespread loss of livestock and physical and communication infrastructure all over Pakistan. The north-south moving floodwaters have wiped out entire towns and villages, leading to the displacement of more than 4 million people. The tragic loss of lives has al-

ready exceeded 1,500. Nearly 288,170 houses have been destroyed. The damage to houses, private property, bridges, roads, hospitals, schools, irrigation system, power transmission and communication lines exceeds billions of dollars.

Millions have already been driven from their homes for refuge in temporary shelters, tents and other makeshift arrangements, but still thousands are stranded on high grounds surrounded by flood waters.

Vast swaths of standing crops have been destroyed. In Punjab Province alone, where people rely heavily on agriculture for their food supply, more than 560,000 hectares of farmland have been destroyed. As the floodwaters move further south toward the Arabian Sea, the loss of lives and property is expected to rise further.

The physical devastation caused by floods is many times larger in scale than the catastrophe Pakistan faced from the earthquake of October 2005. Then the affected area was restricted to 30,000 sq. km while in the recent floods the spread is too wide, covering almost 150,000 sq. km along the entire longitude of the country. Over 12 million people have been affected by the floods compared to 3.2 million in the 2005 earthquake.

An initial emergency response plan is being prepared to cover immediate relief needs such as food, health care, clean water, shelter, agricul ture and others — for the next 90 days. The U.N. has estimat ed that the initial recovery cost would be more than \$460 mil lion, while the estimated reha bilitation and reconstruction in Khyber Pakhtoonkhwa Prov ince might need more than \$2.2 billion to \$2.5 billion. The World Bank will be undertaking the Damage Needs Assessment as soon as water recedes at the end of the monsoons.

On Aug. 3, the government of Japan announced emergency relief goods worth ¥20 million and emergency grant aid of up to \$3 million for the flood-affect ed people. Similarly, some Jap anese NPOs are also consider ing the possibility of extending assistance to the flood-affected people. The government and people of Pakistan appreciate the support offered by the Japa nese government to bring relief to the flood-affected people Any support, both in cash and kind, for the flood-affected people will be welcomed.

As the international community, especially the Japanese people, went all out to support Pakistan during the 2005 earthquake, we hope that they will once again come out and help the flood victims in Pakistan in whatever capacity and with whatever contributions they can.
