New chapter opens in partnership

On this very auspicious occasion of our 39th National Day, I am most honored and privileged to convey, on behalf of the government and people of the United Arab Emirates, my heartfelt greetings and good wishes to Their Imperial Majesties Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko, the government and the great people of Japan. I also extend my sincere felicitations to H.H. Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al-Nahyan, president of the UAE, ruler of Abu Dhabi; H.H. Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al-Maktoum, vice president, prime minister and ruler of Dubai; and to T.H. the members of the Federal Supreme Council of rulers of the emirates.

For the past 39 years, the relationship between the UAE

and Japan has experienced close cooperation in various fields. In fact, both countries have been sharing a genuine enthusiasm to promote further dialogue at all levels, widening the scope of cooperation and deepening the friendly ties. The UAE has become one of Japan's major trading partners, with trade exchange in the past year reaching \$29.23 billion, the seventh largest market for machineries and the second for oil suppliers.

Despite the financial crises that afflicted the world economies last year, the UAE economy has managed to maintain its resiliency, robustness and strong fundamentals, with high expectations that it will resume strong growth within the current fiscal year.

This year again, we opened a new chapter in the partnership between our two countries. The most notable is that Emirates airline and Etihad Airways, the national carriers of the UAE, launched nonstop flights to Narita last March, followed by

the start of Etihad's service to Nagoya in February. The success of this initiative came in line with the guidance of the UAE's prudent leadership and the country's desire for extending the bonds of friendship to the Japanese people. Both airlines have been achieving a remarkable breakthrough in the Japanese aviation market since their inaugurations. I strongly believe that as an air bridge, these new routes will significantly increase the number of Japanese travelers to the UAE and provide an enormous momentum for boosting the economic and tourism activities as well as cultural and educational relations between the UAE and Japan.

Cooperation in educational and cultural relations between the UAE and Japan have been experiencing a great boost, with the numbers of UAE students studying in different Japanese universities more than doubled in recent years. This also reflects the emphasis and importance that the UAE leadership places on education.

It is also important to remember that H.H. Dr. Sheikh Sultan bin Mohammed al Qasimi, ruler of Sharjah, an outstanding cultural figure, inaugurated Japan's first exhibition of Arabian archaeology, "The Arabian Heritage from Shar-

jah, the UAE," in Kanazawa, Ishikawa Prefecture, in April, with the cooperation of Kanazawa University. The one-year tour includes exhibitions in Okayama, Niigata, Nara and Yokohama until March 2011. Paintings, calligraphy and other artworks inspired by UAE Arabian traditions and heritage are displayed at the venue. The best example is a collection of historic maps from the 15th to 19th centuries owned by H.H. Dr. Sheikh Sultan bin Mohammed al Qasimi. The touring exhibition has been presenting visitors with a rare opportunity to have a firsthand experience of UAE culture, history, tradition and national identity.

In terms of energy policy, I assure you that the UAE government will maintain its position as a secure, safe and reliable energy supplier to Japan. Last September, the UAE supplied Japan with 20.5 percent of its total need of oil, making the UAE the second-largest oil and gas supplier to Japan.

In August, over 300 Japanese government officials, policymakers and business executives from the private sector met in Abu Dhabi for the 35th Japan Cooperation Forum for the Middle East, organized by the Japan Cooperation Center for the Middle East (JCCME) and co-hosted by Abu Dhabi.

It is my strong hope that these children who are learning together side by side will one day fulfill the role of acting as a bridge between the two nations.

I believe that the relationship between Japan and the UAE will continue to become increas-

ingly intimate. While I offer my congratulations on this auspicious occasion of the UAE's 39th founding anniversary, may I take this opportunity to express my sincere hope that Japan and the UAE will continue to develop, in particular with the earnest efforts of the people of both countries.
