

Ireland's economic recovery

After five difficult years following the so-called Lehman Shock. Ireland's economy is continuing to show strong signs of recovery. We expect to see our third straight year of GDP (gross domestic product) growth in 2013. We are steadily reducing our public deficit and are on course to meet our target deficit of less than 3 percent by 2015. We have recapitalized our banks on time and below the expected cost.

This progress is being recognized. Two years ago Ireland was locked out of international bond markets. Last year we issued almost €7 billion of treasury bills and bonds and long-term government bond yields are now at less than 4 percent, down from a peak of more than 14 percent. This vear, we intend to be the first EU/ IMF program country in the eurozone to make a sustained return to the sovereign bond markets.

Hard challenges remain, in Ireland and in Europe, above all in bringing down the numbers of unemployed and in spurring stronger growth. But we are on the right track. And we are confident that we will succeed.

Economic links with Japan

Our economic recovery is helped by the strong and growing economic relationship between Ireland and Japan. Bilateral trade between Ireland and Japan exceeded €5 billion in 2012. The growth in food exports to Japan mirrors the significant growth in food trade in Ireland, which has increased by 28 percent in the last three years.

Investment relations with top Japanese brands Alps, Astellas, SMBC and Takeda have also been reinforced this year with further investments by Japanese firms. There has been a dramatic rise in interest in collaborative research and development between the two countries, and 2012 saw Fujitsu Laboratories and NTT Data commence exciting collaboration projects with research centers in Ireland.

Research and development There has been an unprec-

edented level of investment by the Irish government in science

and technology over the last decade. That has helped support a vibrant research community in Ireland, which, in turn, is a substantial platform for a stream of technology-based startups. Ireland has climbed the international ranking of research capability with great speed, moving from 36th in 2003 to the top 20 in recent vears


