

the world cultural and natural heritage sites inscribed on UNESCO list. Spis Castle, one of the UNESCO sites, is among more than two hundred castles and castle ruins in Slovakia. The Kremnica Mint has been making coins since 1328 and is the oldest continuouslyoperating enterprise in the world. Travel back in time and see what life in the Slovak countryside looked like in past conturies. The picturesque wooden village of Cicmany is actually the first-ever folk architecture reservation in the world. The highest wooden Gothic altar in the world by Master Pavol of Levoca, carved from linden wood, can be found in St Jacob Church in Levoca. Unique folk culture of Slovakia can be experienced at many folk festivals that are held around Slovakia in sum-



mer. Interesting gastronomic experience may be found by traveling the Wine Route, especially during autumn when wine harvest is celebrated. The first produce of the season young wine but also more ancient wine gems may be tasted in November, during traditional open-cellar days. In spring lovers of good wine can enjoy St Urban's Say, the feast of the patron of wine and vine-growers. High Tatras and other Slovak mountain ranges offer excellent opportunities for climbing and alpine hiking. There are only four accessible aragonite caves on the planet and Slovakia is one of two European countries to have this unique natural phenomenon - ours is the Ochtinska Aragonite Cave. These attractions, together with traditional cousin and hospitality could become an inspiration for more Japanese travelers to come to Slovakia and spend unforgettable time.

In conclusion, I would like to take this opportunity to convey my sincerest gratitude to numerous Japanese institutions, agencies and friends from all walks of life, including several Japan-Slovakia friendship associations in Japan, for their engagement with Slovakia and valuable contribution to bilateral cooperation and exchanges. There is much more that can be done together and I firmly believe that under the joint efforts of both sides the Slovak - Japan friendly relations will further accelerate its development.
