The copper mining industry is Zambia's main source of income bringing in about 65 percent of foreign exchange earnings through exports.

Zambia's domestic economy is based on agriculture. Maize is the staple food and other food crops include cassava, wheat, millet, vegetables, sugar cane, groundnuts, sweet potatoes, fruits, sorghum and soy beans.

Since the early 1990s, Zambia has pursued market-oriented policies, with the country becoming increasingly integrated in the global economy. This has been done through the privatiza-

tion of state enterprises, removal of unnecessary controls, deregulation of interest and foreign exchange rates, reduction of tariffs, strengthening of the financial sector, and reforms on policies of repatriation of tax profits, dividends and capital.
