On this, the 54th Anniversary of the Independence of Jamaica, it is my great honor and delight to extend my warmest greetings on

my warmest greetings, on behalf of the government and people of Jamaica, to Their Imperial Majesties Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko, the Imperial family, Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and the government and people of Japan.

Over the past year, I have had the high privilege of witnessing the distinct enhancement of relations, which have always been warm and friendly, between Jamaica and Japan in clear and tangible ways. Foremost among these demonstrations of increased support was the official visit that Prime Minister Shinzo Abe made to Jamaica in Sep-

tember 2015. This was a historical moment as it was the first time, since Jamaica and Japan established diplomatic relations in 1964, that a Japanese prime minister visited Iamaica. During the visit, the prime ministers of both countries recommitted themselves to the exploration, with a sense of renewed dynamism, of ways in which to strengthen the relationship between Jamaica and Japan. Furthermore, agreements were signed for the promotion of culture with support being lent by the Japanese government for the improvement of facilities at the Institute of Jamaica, and for the promotion of educational cooperation between the University of the West Indies and Sophia University.

As well, initiatives were taken in March by Westmoreland Parish in Jamaica and Tottori Prefecture to establish the first sister-region cooperative agreement between any Japanese prefecture and a region of any Caribbean nation. Additionally,

in July an agreement was signed between the principals of the Shitamachi Bobsleigh Project and the Jamaica Bobsleigh Team to furnish the team with world-class Japanese sleds for use in the 2018 Pyeongchang Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games. It is, indeed, an exciting time for Jamaica-Japan relations.

However, even as we look ahead at the new areas of coop-

eration that have been formalized, we remain grateful for the long-existing partnerships that have solidified the ties between our two countries. Japan, for instance, still imports and consumes the majority of the yearly production of Jamaica's world-renowned Blue Mountain coffee and Marubeni remains a steadfast part owner of Jamaica's primary power company — Jamaica Public Service. In these ways — and so many others such as support from the Japan International Cooperation Agency and Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers — Japan helps to power Jamaica's economy and development and we are deeply appreciative of those examples of unwavering friendship. We also welcome the opportunities provided to Jamaicans, through the Japan Exchange and Teaching Programme, to impart our English

language skills to young Japanese students while sharing our vast and rich culture in spoken and written word, music, sports and cuisine.


