On the auspicious occa-Serbian Statehood Day — a reminder of the day of Candlemas in when the first Ser-



bian uprising against Ottoman Turks started and the same date in 1835 when the first modern constitution of Serbia was adopted — I would like to extend my greetings and pay respect to Their Imperial Majesties Emperor Akihito and Empress Michiko, the Imperial family, the government and people of Japan. On this important day, I also wish to extend greetings to my fellow Serbians in Japan who, though not numerous, have contributed actively to furthering relations between Serbia and Japan. population.

This year marks 135 years since the commencement of official communications between Serbia and Japan, initiated by the King of Serbia Milan Obrenovic I and Emper-or Meiji. In 1882, the king informed Emperor Meiji about the outcome of the Berlin Congress and the accession of Serbia to the family of European states. Emperor Meiji in reply

expressed his best wishes and environment. Regardless of the readiness to develop friendly relations between the two states. Our two nations and peoples have since had their destinies intertwined during various historical events, and the ties connecting our countries continue today.

The year 2016 has been very difficult and uncertain for Europe and the world, but the stable government in Serbia led by Prime Minister Aleksandar Vucic nevertheless managed to maintain full stability and peace, while achieving significant economic recovery. Serbia has achieved GDP growth of 2.75 percent in 2016 and the government will be working toward higher than 3 percent economic growth this year. My country has regained its position as the top investment destination in the world, measured by the number of jobs relative to the size of the

world-renowned Many companies have recognized our potential and decided to locate their operations in Serbia. For some of them, Serbia serves as a manufacturing hub that enables duty-free exports to a market of 1.1 billion people. Others are attracted by our country's adept level of English proficiency, highly skilled and easily trained workforce and the generous tax and incentive

reason for their initial interest, businesses that decide to set up operations or conduct trade in Serbia encounter a reliable and dynamic country that affords them a much greater opportunity than they initially perceived.

Our government remains strongly committed and focused on pursuing the European Union (EU) accession process. In membership negotiations with the EU, Serbia has to date opened six out of 35 negotiation chapters and this year we will be ready to open 10 more chapters. The preservation of peace and stability is our most important goal for this year, something that is not easy to achieve, especially in a turbulent territory such as the Western Balkans.

The economic, regional and political stability represents a premise for new investments, both international and domestic, and it contributes to build an international image of our country as a reliable partner. Through dialogue, my country will continue the policy of collaboration and of strengthening relations with neighbouring countries to ensure long-term peace and stability. The issue of Kosovo and Metohija remains the key challenge for Serbia. Our government is committed to do its best to continue the dialogue with Pristina, as this is in the best interest of the whole region, but at the same time it will insist on the full implementation of the Brussels agreement reached under the auspices of

the EU. Since the beginning of the European migrant crisis, Serbia has advocated a unified European approach, as well as enhanced coordination of activities, especially with the countries on the so-called West Balkan migrant route. Serbia has had a constructive approach to this crisis, for which it has been congratulated. However, although we have had the same problems as EU member states on the migrant route, we have received substantially less funds and we hope this will change during this year. With regards to this, I would especially like to emphasize that Serbia is particularly grateful to the government of Japan for the valuable assistance provided in facing the challenges in this crisis. Serbia sees Japan as one of

its most important partners and friends and places high priority on further strengthening bilateral ties in all fields, including the economy, culture, science, sports and people-to-people contacts. With good political relations as a starting point, Serbia is looking forward to further strengthening economic ties. The Japanese business community already present in Serbia includes investors in the manufacturing sector, representative offices of trading companies, as well as Serbian companies dealing in Japanese products and services. There is also growing interest in Japanese companies expanding activities to the Serbian market and I hope that continued improvement of the Serbian business environment will result in a larger number of Japanese investors arriving in Serbia in the future.

With preparations underway for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games, I am noticing with great pleasure the increased interest in Serbia among people of all ages in Japan. My country is famous for its sporting achievements and at the Rio 2016 Olympics our athletes won eight medals, including gold in water polo, silver in men's basketball and women's volleyball and bronze in women's basket-

During the past year, many regions and cities throughout Japan have expressed their readiness to welcome Serbian athletes who will be participating in the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games to create opportunities for knowland experience exchanges. Also throughout 2016, many Japanese people visited our embassy in Tokyo to gain a deeper understanding about Serbia, its rich history and cultural heritage, culinary delicacies and diverse traditional folk dances and songs. I feel very grateful that people in Japan have recognized the large potential that my country has in various sports disciplines beyond tennis powerhouse Novak Djokovic. I am convinced that preparations for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games will bring deeper understandings and even closer friendships between our people.

Let me express my sincerest congratulations on the occasion of the Republic of Serbia's National Day. Serbia has experienced





