This plan will most likely generate fresh opportunities for public and private sector investment in major areas

and sectors, including infrastructure, technology, industry, energy, information and communications technology and the green economy.

Blessed with a highly skilled and educated population, and a strategic geographical position at the heart of the Mediterranean, and halfway between Europe, sub-Saharan Africa and the Middle East, Tunisia is an ideal spot for investors looking to expand their business in the region.
