More than 60 years have passed since diplomatic relations between Morocco and Japan were established. Since then our friendship has been continuously enhanced by the privileged ties that bind our two countries.

Road map for the future

Since his enthronement in 1999, the king has promoted and led an ambitious road map in line with the values and principles of Morocco, taking into consideration the regional and international environment marked by the emergence of new challenges and new opportunities.

This ambitious road map underlines an open diplomacy of cooperation and solidarity that reinforces the role that our country plays in the Arab and Islamic arena, besides the African and Euro-Mediterranean levels, as well as the excellent traditional relations with Asian countries, Europe and the Americas.

The regular regional official visits of the king to a number of African countries reflect the kingdom's drive to expand its economic, trade and political ties across sub-Saharan Africa in the framework of south-south

His majesty launched many concrete major projects on African soil such as the African Atlantic Gas Pipeline with Nigeria and the fertilizer production plants that have been set up with both Ethiopia and Nigeria, to name

Morocco's commitment to a policy of diversification has allowed it to experience new markets in the Middle East, Africa, Eastern Europe and North America. Such diver-

sification has been achieved through Free Trade Agreements, in addition to preferential agreements (with the Economic Community of West African States and the Gulf Cooperation Council).

Economic and political stability

Morocco has embarked on a large and comprehensive democratic process of reforms, taking into account the Moroccan specificities related to a long-standing historical and sociocultural heritage and its values based on the principles of solidarity, peace and tolerance.

Advanced regionalization is one of the largest areas of reforms in contemporary Morocco designed to strengthen decentralization and local democracy and empower its 12 regions by enabling human resources in managing public affairs and promoting development-oriented policies.

With a strong commitment to provide favorable incentives for doing business. Morocco maintains a policy of improving the business climate and encouraging private investment. A new industrial strategy (for 2014-2020) was launched to drive structural changes and strengthen the country's position in global value chains.

To promote the international activities of the Moroccan economic institutions and corporations, Casablanca Finance City (CFC) has been established by the Moroccan government as a financial gateway for investors looking to access the fast-growing markets and serves as an interface between the African continent and other parts of the world to reinforce the positioning of Morocco in the international economic arena. Several international institutions have already settled in CFC with the hope that more Japanese financial institutions will follow suit.

By showcasing automotive success stories, Morocco will also increase its attractiveness for foreign investors in other industries, particularly in aeronautics and renewable

Morocco prides itself on establishing the world's largest concentrated solar plant Noor 1, located in Ouarzazate. February 2016 saw Morocco inaugurate the Noor 1 CSP plant. A number of international companies have already shown interest in the Noor-Ouarzazate project, the largest solar energy farm in the world.

Excellent bilateral relations

Within Asia, Japan is a privileged partner for Morocco with whom relations have been intense, touching upon diverse sectors of activities. Our two countries continue to work together to enhance their

cooperation and fulfill their role in regional areas, as well as international forums. Japan and Morocco continue to develop harmoniously and diversify to cover large spheres of activities and cooperation.

From this perspective, the significant Japanese investments made in our country helped in marking Morocco a favorite destination for Japanese businesses. More than 50 Japanese companies are investing and conducting business in a very stable and encouraging environment in Morocco, employing more than 40,000 Moroccan citizens.

Among these companies are Mitsui & Co., Mitsubishi Corp., Marubeni Corp., Yazaki Corp., Sumitomo Electric Industries, Ltd., Fujitsu Ltd., Takata Corp., Denso Corp., YKK Corp., Hino Motors, Ltd., Kansai Paint Co. and others.

As testimony to the trust in Morocco by Japanese corporations, Furukawa Electric Co. has decided to open a fiber-optic cable factory in the city of Tangier seeking to tap growing demand for communications infrastructure in Africa and the Mediterranean region.

The Japanese manufacturer and world's largest supplier of power-assisted steering systems, JTEKT Corp., announced in June the launch of its first Middle East and North Africa region production site in Tangier Med. This plant will produce components and assemble power systems to allow the direct supply of the two automakers installed in Morocco in parallel with other

manufacturers and export markets.

It should be noted that Moroccan-Japanese cooperation, particularly with the Japanese International Cooperation Agency (JICA), is recognized as a success story that has had a positive and direct impact especially for the development of infrastructure and equipment of our country, as well as the implementation of the National Initiative for Human Development.

Regular fishing consultations were conducted in Tokyo in June, marking 31 years of successful cooperation.

Japan is a strategic partner for Morocco in the development of capacity building in areas such as education and scientific research. Regular student and academic exchanges between Moroccan and Japanese universities in different disciplines mark this growing and fruitful cooperation.

Based on the needs of development, Morocco, the Japan Science and Technology Agency and JICA cooperate to promote joint research targeting regional issues through the Science and Technology Research Partnership for Sustainable Development with an objective of future utilization of research outcomes.

Triangular cooperation represents the cornerstone of Morocco's policy in its partnership within Africa. In this perspective, the conclusion of a memorandum of understanding between JICA and the Moroccan Agency for International Cooperation, during the fifth Tokyo Interna-

tional Conference on African Development (TICAD V) in 2013 in Yokohama, and the memorandum of understanding signed at TICAD VI in Nairobi in 2016 have further consolidated the partnership for promoting both bilateral and triangular cooperation as an efficient means for promoting business and capacity-building in areas of common interest for both Morocco and Japan.

The successful TICAD VI, for which we congratulate the government of Japan, confirms the uniqueness and inclusiveness of a process that positively evolved over the last 23 years. In this regard, Morocco is looking forward to the success of the 2019 TICAD VII in Yokohama, which will be a milestone in the excellent relations between Japan and Africa.

Committed to approaching international challenges within multilateral frameworks, Morocco hosted the 22nd Conference of the Parties to the U.N. Framework on Climate Change (COP 22) in the city of Marrakech in November and continues its presidency throughout this
