Friendly bilateral relations develop for mutual benefit

On the auspicious occasion of the celebration marking the 64th Anniversary of Cambodia's Independence Day on Nov. 9, as a day of remembrance, pride, joy and strength, I would

Imperial family, His Excellency Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and the great people of Japan.

Cambodian people always remember the great crusade for independence of Cambodia by His Majesty the Late King Father Norodom Sihanouk, who is the father of independence, territorial integrity and national unity. The country owed the Late King Father a debt of gratitude for what he achieved. Without his eminent efforts, Cambodia would not have obtained independence from France.

Cambodia and Japan share a long history of diplomatic ties profoundly rooted since the Angkor era. The friendly relations between Cambodia and Japan were more strengthened in the Sangkum Reastra Niyum era under the leadership of the Late King Father "Preah Barom Ratanakaodh." Close dialogue and cooperation at various levels have been maintained until today under the effective leadership of King Norodom Sihamoni and the government of Cambodia headed by Samdech Akka Moha Sena Padei Techo Hun

Sen, the Prime Minister of Cambodia. During more than two decades in which Cambodia was engulfed in political turbulence and then civil war, the bilateral ties of Cambodia and Japan were suspended. Then, in the lead-up to the signing of the Paris Peace Accord on Oct. 23, 1991, Japan exercised a prominent role in the preliminary nego-

tiations in bringing all the warring factions together and helping them reconcile. During the implementation of the 1991 Paris Peace Accord, Japan played an active role in support for the restoration of peace in Cambodia by dispatching personnel to U.N. peacekeeping operations (PKO) to support the peacekeeping activities of the U.N. Transitional Authority in Cambodia in establishing a new Cambodian government and by positively contributing to the consultative group meetings for Cambodia. These activities are excellent examples of Japan's efforts in this regard.

This year marks the 25th anniversary of Japan's first dispatch of peacekeeping personnel in September 1992 to Cambodia after the enactment of Japan's International Peace Cooperation Law that was aimed at contributing to U.N. peacekeeping operations to foster global peace.

I am very proud that Cambodia, the country where Japan engaged in a full-fledged PKO for the first time, is now actively contributing to the international community by dispatching personnel for U.N. PKO. Since 2006, Cambodia has sent more than 4,700 personnel with great success and praise on U.N. peacekeeping missions to a number of countries that are hot spots in the world, including Sudan, South Sudan, the Central

African Republic, Chad, Syria, Lebanon and Mali. Cambodia is proud of its unwavering commitment to U.N. peacekeeping efforts.

After the establishment of the Royal Government of Cambodia as a result of the 1993 general election, Japan has continued to contribute to the reconstruction and development of Cambodia.

Since 1992, Japan has been Cambodia's biggest donor, giving more than \$2 billion in official development assistance (ODA), focusing on a broad range of areas, including rehabilitation and reconstruction of infrastructure, poverty alleviation, good governance and rule of law, human resource development, human security and the integration of Cambodia into the region and the world. Japan is also one of the biggest financial contributors to the Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia (ECCC), also known as the Khmer Rouge Tribunal. The government of Japan has been assisting the ECCC since its inception and, as of today, the financial assistance from Japan amounts to \$86.34 million, approximately 31 percent of the total funds contributed by donors to the national and U.N. components of the ECCC.

On behalf of the government of Cambodia and Cambodian people, I would like to express our heartfelt thanks to the government and people of Japan for their contribution to the Cambodian peace process, the continuous support for the reconstruction and development of Cambodia and democracy-building in Cambodia.

For Japan, Cambodia is becoming an important partner in the region. Cambodia is a new destination for Japanese investors. In 2016, Japan was the third-biggest foreign investor in Cambodia, with \$822 million in investment capital, accounting for about 22.78 percent of the total foreign investment in the country. As of 2017, Cambodia saw 125 Japanese investment projects, equivalent to more than \$1.5 billion.

Cambodia's market also has potential for Japanese investment in the service sector as seen by the investment in the Aeon Mall I and II, direct flights from Tokyo to Phnom Penh and many Japanese restaurants in special economic zones.

In another development, Japan will open a consular office in Siem Reap province in January in response to the increasing number of Japanese tourists visiting Cambodia and trade between the two countries. Japan ranked seventh in terms of total tourist arrivals to Cambodia last year.

Diplomatic relations between Cambodia and Japan were established in 1953 and 60 years later, the bilateral relations of both countries were upgraded to a strategic partnership in December 2013, laying out a new page of friendship and cooperation between the two countries. Ties between the two nations have strengthened since 2013. The visit of Prime Minister Hun Sen to Japan from Aug. 6 to 9 was a significant showcase for the implementation and consolidation of our strategic partnership and commitment to expand ties between Cambodia and Japan.

In the Cambodia-Japan summit meeting in Tokyo on Aug. 7, Prime Minister Abe highly appreciated Cambodia's participation in PKO missions in recent years and stated that Japan will continue to implement defense capacity building assistance to Cambodian personnel. He also praised the smooth implementation of the results of recent local elections and expressed the expectation that Cambodia's next national election will be conducted in a free and fair manner, noting that Japan will continue to provide electoral reform assistance. He also noted that Japan will continue to cooperate in the Khmer Rouge trials.

In response, Prime Minister Hun Sen expressed appreciation to Japan's prime minister for implementing the electoral reform assistance he had requested on the occasion of the Japanese prime minister's visit to Cambodia in 2013. He also expressed gratitude for Japan's assistance for demining, for the implementation of defense capacity building assistance and for Japan's contribution to Khmer Rouge trials, noting that Cambodia

has consistently supported Japan's efforts to play a major role in security-related fields, and reiterating support for Japan's proactive contribution to peace.

Moreover, Prime Minister Hun Sen expressed his appreciation for the assistance provided by Japan to date, including in human resources development, noting that he is extremely satisfied that bilateral cooperation has been realized in a variety of fields and that the Kizuna and Tsubasa bridges have improved connectivity with Cambodia's neighboring countries. He also noted that investment by Japanese companies in Cambodia has been increasing in recent years and that he is also seeking to further develop the investment environment. He also expressed appreciation for the continued high level of people-to-people exchanges and for the establishment of the Consular Office of Japan in Siem Reap.

Since the two nations signed a strategic partnership agreement in 2013, trade and security cooperation have also been elevated.

In 2016, trade between Japan and Cambodia reached \$1.3 billion and both sides have agreed to make efforts to increase bilateral trade by a further \$2 billion in the coming years. Exports to Japan are also increasing, with exports up 4.5 percent in the first half of 2017 from the same period last year.

Defense ties are also being strengthened. In September, Cambodia's Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of National Defense Tea Banh visited Japan, while in February, three ships from the Japanese Maritime Self-Defense Force visited Cambodia.

In the decades since 1994, under the talented, brilliant and wise leadership of Prime Minister Hun Sen, Cambodia has gone through a remarkable transformation in political, security and socioeconomic aspects. Indeed, for more than two decades, Cambodia has maintained firm political and macroeconomic stability fundamental to the development of all fields and has become a middle-income country. called Cambodia one of the eight "Olympian Growth" economies and ranked Cambodia as the sixth-fastest growing economy in the world with robust economic growth at an average of around 7.7 percent over the last several decades. This strong growth resulted in the poverty rate declining significantly from 47.8 percent in 2007 to 13.5 percent in 2014. Recently, the Asian Development Bank has been impressed with the economic growth of Cambodia and the rapid expansion of the industry sector, naming Cambodia a new tiger cub in Asia. Cambodia is committed to maintain macroeconomic stability, with annual growth around 7 percent in the medium and long-term to realize her goal to become a middle-to-high-income country by 2030 and a high-income country by 2050.

To support this vision, the government of Cambodia has adopted and is actively implementing the Industrial Development Policy (IDP) 2015-2025, which is a new growth strategy, or road map, for building a production base with higher added value to ensure the continuing transformation of the Cambodian economy, to increase the competitiveness and transparency of doing business in Cambodia and to maintain healthy economic growth with a clear structure.

The adoption of the IDP was also in parallel with the establishment of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Economic Community (AEC), in which Cambodia is forging its linkage to the regional market, or "Asian factory," that is dynamic and full of potential through the investment to expand the production base, building and improving transport networks and logistic systems, developing physical tourism infrastructure, promoting trade facilitation, developing financial systems and reforming legal systems and institutions.

For the last few decades, Cambodia's tourism sector has seen a remarkable boom. While successfully securing peace, political stability, security and social order, Cambodia has paid great attention to the tourism sector, which has been deemed to be "green gold." Thanks to this effort, Cambodia received around 5 million international tourists in 2016, an increase of 5 percent compared to 2015, with Japanese tourists totaling 191,577, which helped inject \$3.2 billion into the national economy, equal to 13 percent of gross domestic product in 2016.

The number of international tourists visiting Cambodia is predicted to reach 5.5 million in 2017, and by 2020 the figure will reach 7 million, generating \$5 billion in revenue and nearly 1 million jobs nationwide. In the period of just two months in 2017, Cambodia received 1.3 million international tourists, with Japanese tourists totaling 40,000, an increase of 11 percent. In 2020, we hope that Cambodia will see 300,000 Japanese tourists.

To achieve the government's vision for

receiving international tourists, the Royal Embassy of Cambodia in Japan often organizes both big and small events inside and outside the embassy to increase further awareness among Japanese people of Cambodian culture, thereby encouraging them to visit Cambodia. In May, the embassy, the nonprofit Cambodian Community and Cambodian Students Association in Japan, as well as Khmer-loving Japanese people, in cooperation with the Ministry of Tourism of Cambodia, organized Cambodia Festival 2017, a large event at Yoyogi Park in Tokyo. Over the twoday festival, we organized various cultural events that attracted nearly 100,000 Japanese people to this successful event.

In addition, Cambodia is determined to develop itself into an attractive, clean and green tourist destination in the region, based on the features of Angkor Temple as a world wonder, the sacred site of Preah Vihear Temple, tangible and intangible cultural heritage, natural heritage, beautiful bays and pristine beaches, Khmer cuisine, the friendliness of Cambodian people, long-standing tradition and warm hospitality toward tourists, deserving the motto of "Cambodia - Kingdom of Wonder — Feel the Warmth." On July 8 UNESCO added Sambor Prei Kuk in the Khmer language, or "temple in the richness of the forest" to its World Heritage list. We hope that with Cambodia's inspiring and tumultuous history, even more tourists from around the world, especially Japanese people, will be visiting Cambodia, home to Angkor Wat and Sambor Prei Kuk, Cambodia's newest world heritage site, and numerous other attractive cultural heritages.

In this connection, I wish to sincerely invite Japanese tourists and investors to visit and explore, and evaluate the vast business and investment opportunities in our country.

The year 2017 is a landmark year for ASEAN as the organization commemorates the 50th anniversary of its founding. Over

the last 50 years, ASEAN has been resolute in pursuing integration in the areas of politics, security, the economy, society and culture. Thus, the ASEAN community was founded at the end of 2015. During these five decades, ASEAN has played a major role in ensuring the stability and prosperity not only in its own region, but also in the whole of Asia.

After the civil wars and internal strife, Cambodia has been steadily transforming its image and is actively participating in regional and global affairs on equal footing with other countries. It is worthwhile to recall that Cambodia's latest admission to ASEAN in April 1999 united all nations in Southeast Asia under the ASEAN roof. The realization of ASEAN-10 has not only a symbolic significance, but also immense implications for the cause of the regional unity and solidarity.

Now, Cambodia has become a young and dynamic player in the region, having chaired ASEAN in 2002 and 2012, despite being the newest member. A historic document — the declaration of conduct in the South China Sea — was adopted in Phnom Penh in 2002 with much fanfare.

Cambodia has raised ASEAN's profile and led the region's endeavors in terms of mine action. The ASEAN leaders' statement on the establishment of the ASEAN Regional Mine Action Center (ARMAC) was adopted at the 21st ASEAN Summit in 2012 in Phnom Penh. The ARMAC has now been launched following the inauguration of the center in May last year.

We are justifiably proud of what Cambodia has accomplished in the past few years in preparation for the AEC, and we believe that our small nation with youthful energy, the potential for development and central geographic location is set to play a major role in the AEC.

As the newest member of ASEAN, we have contributed to the success of, and benefited from, the AEC. With our success story to share with the world, the World Economic Forum (WEF) organized a WEF summit on ASEAN in Cambodia this year. This was a great honor for Cambodia to host this prestigious summit successfully in May in Phnom Penh, as it brought approximately 700 business and political leaders, members of society and aca-



Fostering cultural rehabilitation

I hereby wish to convey my warmest and most sincere congratulations to the people of Cambodia, on the occasion of the 64th Anniversary of Independence. In the 1970s and 1980s,

Cambodia was embroiled in a civil war, and in 1975 the Khmer Rouge assumed power. The war damaged many aspects of Cambodia, specifically its educational system, and also had a highly detrimental effect on the preservation and restoration of the cultural heritage site of Angkor Wat.

The Khmer rulers erected Angkor Wat 800 years ago as part of their Hindu worship, but over time the temple transformed into

a Buddhist sanctuary, and today it remains an object of faith for Cambodians. It symbolizes Cambodian national identity, and the preservation of this valuable site will aid in nation-building and national reconciliation. restoring the peace and serenity of the Angkor era. Aiding or preserving Angkor Wat is equal to sustaining cultural rehabilitation.

In 1993, I made the following proposition to the new government, namely, "Let us become friends and return to the tranquil days of Angkor Wat. During the 24 years of civil war four groups fought each other, but now let us gather them all together at Angkor Wat." I believe cultural rehabilitation to be the reconstruction of peace, and with this goal in mind we embarked upon the restoration of the Western Causeway of Angkor Wat Phase I project. I still recall the occasion in January 2000 when His Excellency Prime Minister Hun Sen and His Excellency Prime Minister Keizo Obuchi visited Angkor Wat's Western Causeway, with the former proclaiming, "The restoration of Angkor Wat is the reconstruction of the Kingdom of Cambodia." The philosophy of global cooperation engaged in by our Sophia University Angkor International Mission, currently known as the Sophia Asia Center for Research and Human Development, is embodied in the words, "The preservation and restoration of Cambodian cultural heritage should be conducted by Cambodians for Cambodians."

I was honored to receive the Ramon Magsaysay Award for 2017. This prestigious award is not the outcome of my own merit alone, but the merit of my numerous colleagues and friends, both Japanese and Cambodians. In addition to this award I also received a congratulatory message from the Cambodian prime minister, a portion of which stated, "The Royal Government of Cambodia wishes to extend its deepest appreciation to you and your entire team for your continuous contribution toward the protection and conservation of cultural heritage, a significant contribution to sustainable development."

While Cambodia's nominal gross domestic product more than doubled during the past decade from 2007 to 2016, because of its open economy approach and friendly and liberalized trade and investment climate, the trade (exports and imports) between Cambodia and Japan, and Japanese foreign direct investment flow in Cambodia grew ever faster, increasing by 7.4 times and 6.4 times, respectively, during the same period. Fueled by the strategic location in the heart of Indochina, Southeast Asia's dynamic center, in 2016, Japanese investment capital in Cambodia amounted to \$3.6 billion, which made Japan the third-biggest investor in the country, according to the Council for the Development of Cambodia. The number of Japanese-affiliated companies in the country reached 270 in 2016, 3.6 times more than that of five years ago, which is also an out-

standing rate of increase compared to other ASEAN member states that see an average of about two times, according to Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs. These developments will increase regional production networks involving Cambodia as Japanese companies are spearheading efforts to create regional value chains in ASEAN. As such, Japanese investors have contributed to expanding Cambodia-Japan relations.

This year marks the golden jubilee of the establishment of ASEAN; and it has entered a new phase for creating a further consolidated community. I would like to commend the Kingdom of Cambodia, as a vibrant and powerful member of ASEAN, for playing an important role in developing even stronger and closer ASEAN-Japan relationships. I look forward to continuing work with the people of Cambodia to fortify cooperation bilaterally and within the framework of ASEAN.

Finally, I cordially extend my heartfelt wishes of happiness and further prosperity to the Kingdom of Cambodia.

Transitional Authority in Cambodia (UNTAC) as its first full-scale activity under the Act on Cooperation with United Nations Peacekeeping Operations and Other Operations, adopted in the same year. A total of 1,332 Japanese were engaged in such activities as monitoring the ceasefire, observing elections, advising

local police and rehabilitating roads.

This year marks the 25th anniversary since the enactment of Japan's Act on Cooperation with U.N. Peacekeeping Operations. Our experience in Cambodia is the genesis of Japan's peacekeeping efforts and its policy of proactive contribution to peace. We are proud that our two countries have together been working for peace in the world. At a summit meeting in August this year, the two leaders agreed to promote further cooperation in a wide range of areas based on the achievements to date. I sincerely hope that the friendly relationship between Japan and the Kingdom of Cambodia will deepen further in the future.
