In the application of the conclusions of that dialogue, a referendum was successfully organized on Aug. 5 and with a very high positive vote, the Mauritanian population decided to instate a new flag, new national anthem and bring some changes in various constitutional bodies, along with the suppression of the Senate.

All of these changes will be applied soon after the finalization of the legislative process; only the suppression of the Senate was immediate.

Under our president's leadership, Mauritania is playing a key role in building a strong G5 Sahel, an organization to fight against terrorism.

The dedication of Mauritanian troops to the peacekeeping operations in various countries is yet another sign of the commitment of Mauritania to the necessity of global diplomacy for peace and stability in Africa.

The exchange between the foreign ministers of our two countries in Cairo during the Arab-Japan Political Dialogue and in New York during the last U.N. General Assembly have shown our common views on many international issues.

Mauritania stands resolutely committed to economic liberalism. The focus on the realization of efficient infrastructure is a clear indicator of its determination to achieve the U.N.'s Sustainable Development Goals. Mauritania's bid to achieve these goals is stimulated by the generous assistance of friendly nations like Japan,
