On education, we are committed to discovering and enhancing new forms of knowledge between our societies, a keystone required by the global agenda for constructing a future together. For that purpose, we are working with Japanese universities to extend their scholarship programs to Chile. The possibilities for Chilean undergraduates, graduates and Ph.D. candidates to continue their education in Japan is a reality. Also, the number of Japanese students and academics going to Chile has shown a constant increase in the last several years. Likewise, the entry into

force of the working holiday program this year will allow 200 young Chilean and Japanese people to visit and work in our countries every year.

Innovation is an exciting topic. Japan is a country where innovation can be found everywhere. In every city of this wonderful country, we can find small and medium-sized enterprises, corporations and academic entities that work tirelessly in researching and constructing new developments, both for industry and the common people. Chile has recognized that we are in the middle of the "Fourth Industrial Revolution," and that we must be an active part of it, so artificial intelligence, robotics and a futuristic view of society is the path to follow. For example, our country is eager to learn from the Japanese experience regarding innovation applied to aging

policies. The government of President Sebastian Pinera has made facing the challenges derived from an aging population a priority. For that purpose, first lady Cecilia Morel is leading a program called Positive Aging, promoting the full integration of elderly citizens into society, with better quality standards for their life expectancy.

In the global economy, Chile has been an outstanding voice for promoting free trade. We are fully committed to the entry into force of the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership, and we have joined with Japan against protectionism, pursuing free trade within the rule of law and fair competition.
