In recent years, the numbers of trekkers and summiteers from Japan have increased. Nepal has designated the year 2020 as "Visit Nepal Year." With direct flights between Nepal and Japan, which will commence in the near future, visitors can enjoy an affordable and comfortable travel experience to Nepal.
