This year, Colombia is celebrating 200 years of Independence. On behalf of President Ivan Duque Marquez and the people of Colombia, I would like to express special greetings to Their Majesties the

for their continued support to our nation. Having lived in Japan since 2011 representing the Colombian Coffee Growers, I celebrate that my new responsibilities as ambassador of Colombia, since April, coincide with the beginning of the new Reiwa Era. In August 2018, the president's government received a strong democratic mandate to build a more equitable country through legality and entrepreneurship, based on

innovation and sustainability. The Colombian government is committed to securing the best possible implementation of the final agreement with the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia guerrilla, negotiated by the previous administration. The strengths of that agreement had been overestimated and its weaknesses underestimated. Colombia values Japan's support in dealing with the challenges encountered on the path of transformation led by the president to unify the nation, seeking genuine peace.

The orange economy, innovation and creative industries are considered by this government as a long-term source of economic growth. Recently, a Colombian start-up created only four years ago by young entrepreneurs received an investment of \$1 billion by a well-known Japanese company. The commitment of the government to maintain sound economic policies and its continuous support of the private sector make Colombia an ideal destination for Japanese companies of all sectors seeking to expand their operations or to invest in joint ventures.

Colombia hopes to conclude the negotiation of an economic partnership agreement (EPA) with Japan shortly. The EPA will increase trade and investment and benefit the citizens of both countries.

The commemoration of Colombia's independence is an excellent occasion to renew our country's continuous effort to strengthen and diversify the bilateral relations.

In celebration, the embassy invites the public to Tokyo Skytree Town's Sky Arena on July 20 to an exhibition about Colombia. It will be open from 10 a.m., with traditional dances performed at 5 p.m. followed by illuminating Tokyo Skytree with the colors of the Colombian flag.
