Myriad of opportunities follow Saudi-Japan Vision 2030's launch

On the auspicious occasion of the National Day of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, I would like to extend on behalf of the Japan-Saudi Arabia Society our wholehearted

congratulations to the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, His Royal Highness Crown Prince Mohammad bin Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, Ambassador of Saudi Arabia to Japan Nayef Mrzouq Alfahadi and the people of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

In April, I succeeded my predecessor, the late Chairman Hiromasa Yonekura, as chairman of the Japan-Saudi Arabia Society, which has a heritage of nearly 60 years. Going forward, I am committed to further strengthening the friendly relations between Japan and Saudi Arabia, in collaboration with the ambassador, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, other relevant organizations and member companies of the Japan-Saudi Arabia Society.

As everyone is aware, Saudi Arabia has abundant oil resources, which have financed the development of the nation. Oil has also been at the core of the friendly partnership forged between Japan and Saudi Arabia over many years. In 2016, Saudi Arabia unveiled the Saudi Vision 2030, a comprehensive national strategy aimed at overcoming its dependence on oil resources. I understand that, since then, the Saudi economy and society have undergone transformations at whirlwind speed. This has coincided

with Japan-Saudi relations entering an entirely new stage.

In March 2017, when the king visited Japan, the two countries agreed on the Saudi-Japan Vision 2030. This agreement states that Japan supports the Saudi Vision 2030 with public and private sectors working together not only in conventional areas, such as energy and infrastructure cooperation, but also on programs for developing manga and game creators, training financial specialists, human resource development projects, including for small and medium enterprise planning, and cultural exchanges.

In June, a ministerial meeting was held in Tokyo, attended by then-Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Hiroshige Seko and former Minister of Energy, Industry and Mineral Resources Khalid bin Abdulaziz Al Falih. The two sides agreed upon the Saudi-Japan Vision 2030 2.0 outlining the progress of the cooperation projects carried out between the two countries.

When the Saudi-Japan Vision 2030 was agreed upon in 2017, it covered 31 projects by 41 government agencies and private companies in the two countries. Today, the number of projects has increased to 64, and the number of participating government agencies and private companies in both countries has risen to 64. Japan has already established the Saudi-Japan Vision Office in Riyadh for supporting the Saudi-Japan Vision 2030 cooperation projects, and it has been announced that Saudi Arabia plans to establish the Saudi-Japan Vision Office in Tokyo by the end of this year for advancing the projects. With these developments, I expect that the two countries will have even closer cooperative relations.
