The celebration of the 65th anniversary of the Algerian Revolution coincides with an important and historic moment in Japan: the beginning of the Reiwa Era and the enthronement of His Majesty Emperor

Naruhito. It also takes place in the wake of the Seventh Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD 7). As a sign of the importance Algeria attaches to TICAD, Prime Minister Nouredine Bedoui led a delegation of high-ranking officials, including Minister of Foreign Affairs Sabri Boukadoum.

The meeting between Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and his Algerian counterpart was a great opportunity to continue high-level consultations in the spirit of those held in Algiers in December 2018 when former Minister of Foreign Affairs Taro Kono visited.

This year, celebrations also coincide in a context particularly important in the lives of Algerians and the Algerian State.

Since Feb. 22, an unprecedented democratic dynamic has taken hold in Algeria. The response of authorities to popular demands in a peaceful, civilized and responsible manner promise new horizons in the near future at all levels of social, political, institutional and economic life in Algeria.

Thanks to this, Algeria is preparing for a presidential election to be held on Dec. 12, under a renovated legal and institutional framework. The entire electoral process will

be supervised by an independent body, from the beginning until the announcement of the results, with equal representation for the candidates in the election.

This process is also promising for Japanese partners, especially Japanese companies in Algeria and investors. Algerian authorities have proactively launched reforms to improve the business climate and make investment conditions much more flexible.

These reforms, which are an important message to Japanese companies, respond to their expectations and concerns. They will certainly strengthen our countries' already long-standing, diversified and mutually beneficial economic cooperation.

Promising business prospects will certainly be supported by the new legal framework for economic cooperation currently being negotiated.
